I AM DEBTOR

Reading: Matthew 28:18-20 Text: Romans 1:11 – 17

Introduction:

- 1. In studying the "I Am" statements of Jesus, many things about His nature and work were learned.
- 2. However, the overarching lesson was that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God and, therefore, the only source of salvation for man.
- 3. The fact of who Jesus is demands who His followers, Christians, must be!
- 4. Thus, it is important to notice several "I Aм" statements of the Christian...
- I. I AM A DEBTOR TO CHRIST
 - A. Debtor is "one who owes another; one held by some obligation, bound by some duty."
 - B. Paul was in debt to man because he was in debt to Christ.
 - 1. Yet, one must understand the debt owed...
 - 2. Matthew 18:23-35.
 - a. The man in the parable owed a debt which he could not pay.
 - b. But his master simply forgave him the debt.
 - c. Yet, he was still indebted to his master for when he did not act appropriately he was punished.
 - d. His new debt was not of money or even service—it was a debt of honor, respect and love.
 - You and I owed a debt that we could never pay—we were slaves to Satan by sin.
 - 4. But Jesus purchased our freedom with His blood. He washed away the debt on the cross (Rom. 6:23).

5. "Gone is all my debt of sin, And to live I now begin, Yet the debt I did not pay Sweeping all the debt away,

> Oh, I hope to please Him now, As at His dear feet I bow, Making His the debt I owed, So I'm singing on the road

A great change is bro't within, Risen from the fall; Someone died for me one day, Jesus paid it all.

Light of joy is on my brow, Safe within His love. Freedom true He has bestowed; To my home above."

"He paid a debt He did not owe,
I owed a debt I could not pay.
I needed someone to wash my sins away.
And now I sing a brand new song: 'Amazing Grace.'
Christ Jesus paid the debt that I could never pay."

"I hear the Savior say, Child of weakness, watch and pray, Jesus paid it all, Sin had left a crimson stain, 'Thy strength indeed is small; Find in Me thine all in all.' All to Him I owe; He washed it white as snow."

- C. The price Jesus paid to remove man's debt of sin causes man to become indebted to Christ—with a debt of gratitude and love.
 - 1. Because of what he did for us, we choose to live for Him!
 - 2. Again, this is a debt we can never repay (Luke 17:7-10).
 - a. Yes, we obey the rules...
 - b. Yes, we serve others...
 - c. Yes, we help the poor, needy, suffering, etc.
 - d. Yes, we evangelize...
 - e. Yes, we attend services and worship God...
 - f. But, not for worldly acknowledgement, not for a pat on the back, not because we are forced to, not to pay the debt!
 - 3. Love has become the motivating factor of our lives!
- II. I AM A DEBTOR TO THE WORLD
 - A. Because he was in debt to Christ, Paul was also in debt to the world (Greeks and Barbarians). {Jew and Gentile...}

- It is a debt of service to Christ.
 - 1. Why did Paul feel a debt to preach to the world?
 - 2. Because God commanded him to (Mark 16:15-16).
 - 3. Because God called him to (Acts 22:14-16, 21; 26:16-18).
 - 4. He loved Jesus enough to do what He commanded! {In spite of persecution, hardship, etc.}
- C. It is a debt of love for the world.
 - 1. Paul realized that the debt which Jesus paid on Calvary was not his alone—every soul owed that same debt!
 - 2. Read—Romans 1:14-17
 - 3. He knew that salvation was only in Christ and available through the Gospel. Thus, he preached it everywhere!
- D. It is our debt also.
 - 1. Do we love Jesus enough to do what He commands?
 - a. He has told us to evangelize (Matt. 28:18-20; 2 Tim. 2:2).
 - b. Do we feel a debt toward the world because of what Jesus did for us and them?
 - c. We have salvation from sins! They need it! Jesus is the only solution to the problem.
 - d. We have the message of salvation! They must hear it! Who else can or will preach the Gospel?
 - 2. Do we love the world enough to serve them?

Conclusion:

- 1. Because of who Jesus is, there are certain things that I must be.
- 2. I am a debtor to Christ for the sacrifice He made for my sins.
- 3. I am a debtor to the world for Jesus has given me the plan of salvation.
