Text: Daniel 6:10-11

Introduction:

- 1. Prayer will be a vital part of the life of an active, faithful, growing congregation.
- 2. The Bible clearly teaches both the purpose and power of prayer.
- 3. To be a church that is pleasing to God, we must be a praying church...
- I. Why Should the Church Pray? (Isaiah 56:7; Matthew 21:13)
 - A. To be like Jesus.
 - 1. Prayer is mentioned 545 times in the Bible (511 verses).
 - 2. 62 times Jesus is mentioned in connection with prayer.
 - 3. 22 times it is recorded that Jesus prayed.
 - 4. If we desire to be like Jesus, we must be people of prayer.
 - B. To be like the early church.
 - 1. From the beginning, the church continued steadfastly in prayer (Acts 2:42).
 - 2. Praying is mentioned 34 times in the book of Acts.
 - 3. It was at the top of the Apostles' "to do" list (Acts 6:4).
 - 4. It was vital to elders and preachers (Acts 20:36).
 - 5. No one can stop the church from praying (Daniel; 1 Pet. 5:8).
 - C. To obey the Bible.
 - 1. There are 70 New Testament verses on baptism.
 - 2. There are 163 on prayer!
 - 3. We ought always to pray (Luke 5:33-35; 18:1).
- II. What Happens When the Church Prays?
 - A. God sends workers (Matthew 9:37-38).
 - B. God opens doors (Colossians 4:2-3; Acts 14:27; Revelation 3:7-8).
 - C. God gives boldness (Acts 4:23-31; Ephesians 6:18-20).
 - D. God gives power (2 Thessalonians 1:11; Mark 14:38).
 - E. God gives growth (Romans 15:30-32; Colossians 1:10).
 - F. God increases contribution (2 Corinthians 9:6-14).
 - G. God grants wisdom (Ephesians 1:16-17; Col. 1:9; James 1:1-6).
