

“ALL THINGS”

- I. “All Things” of Creation (John 1:1-3)
 - A. The Creation reveals the power and authority of God.
 - B. Everything that exists belongs to Him (Heb. 3:4).

- II. “All Things” of Inspiration (Luke 24:44)
 - A. All Old Testament prophecies were fulfilled in Jesus (cf. John 19:28).
 - B. All New Testament teaching comes from the same source (John 14:26; Acts 3:22).
 - C. Thus, all Scripture is inspired and is all-sufficient (2 Tim. 3:16; 2 Pet. 1:3).

- III. “All Things” of Exaltation (Col. 1:16-18)
 - A. Power in Creation grants Him authority above all.
 - B. This authority is honored in the church (Eph. 1:22-23).
 - C. He deserves man’s obedience (Heb. 1:3; 4:13; Phil. 2).

- IV. “All Things” of Proclamation (Matt. 28:18-20)
 - A. The inspired Gospel must be preached to all men.
 - B. Men must be obedient in “all things” (1 Thes. 5:21; Titus 2:7; Heb. 13:18).

- V. “All Things” of Salvation (2 Cor. 5:17-21)
 - A. The power of the cleansing blood of Jesus!
 - B. Every sin is forgiven, every stain is cleansed, every condemnation is removed!

- VI. “All Things” of Consolation (Phil. 4:11-13)
 - A. The promise of endurance
 - B. The promise of victory (Matt. 19:26)
 - C. The promise of prayer (Matt. 21:22)
 - D. The promise of comfort (Rom. 8:28, 32)

- VII. “All Things” of Invitation (Rev. 21:5-7)
 - A. In Heaven, “all things” will be made new.
 - B. In Heaven, the faithful will inherit “all things.”
 - C. Thus, God has made “all things” ready and invites all to that eternal home (Luke 14:17).
