THOU SHALT NOT COMMIT ADULTERY

Introduction:

- 1. Throughout this study, it must be emphasized that man today is not under the Law of Moses including the Ten Commandments.
- 2. However, the things that "were written aforetime were written for our learning" (Rom. 15:4).
- 3. THOU SHALT HAVE NO OTHER GODS BEFORE ME
- 4. THOU SHALT NOT MAKE ANY GRAVEN IMAGE
- 5. THOU SHALT NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD THY GOD IN VAIN
- 6. REMEMBER THE SABBATH DAY, TO KEEP IT HOLY
- 7. HONOR THY FATHER AND THY MOTHER
- 8. THOU SHALT NOT KILL

I. Definition of Terms

A. Marriage

- 1. Marriage is an institution ordained by God (Gen. 2:21-24).
- 2. Marriage is a union between one man and one woman (Matt. 19:3-6).
 - a. One who has never before been married
 - b. One whose spouse has died (Rom. 7:2-3; 1 Cor. 7:39)
 - c. One whose spouse has been divorced because of fornication (Matt. 19:7-9; cf. Mark 10:11-12; 1 Cor. 7:10-11)
- 3. Marriage is a lifelong commitment based upon love (Eph. 5:28-31).
- 4. Marriage is the only divinely authorized realm in which a sexual relationship may occur (1 Cor. 6:16; 7:2-5; Heb. 13:4).
- 5. Marriage is an earthly relationship (Matt. 22:30).

B. Fornication

- 1. The Hebrew word that is translated as 'fornication' means, "To act as a harlot; thus, to commit fornication or adultery." {It also had to do with idolatry or being unfaithful to God.}
- 2. The Greek word for 'fornication' means, "Harlotry; illicit sexual activity; to indulge in unlawful lust."
- 3. Fornication is sexual activity with another that is not authorized by God
- 4. Adultery is a type of fornication (cf. 1 Cor. 5:1).

C. Adultery

- 1. Adultery is sexual activity with another who is married to someone else.
- 2. Sometimes, the words 'adultery' and 'fornication' are used interchangeably.
