Introduction:

- 1. The New Testament uses many terms and concepts to describe the church of Christ.
- 2. As members of the church, it is important for us to know what the church is and what the Lord expects it to be.
- 3. Thus, as we study these divine descriptions of the church, we will learn how we are to conduct ourselves individually and as a congregation of God's people.
- 4. Before we discuss the specific terms of designation, there are a few fundamental facts that must be considered.
- 5. First, we must understand the role of the church in God's plan of redemption...
 - a. Eternal purpose
 - b. Connected to the crucifixion
 - c. Result of the resurrection
- I. The Church in Purpose

(Ephesians 3:8-12)

II. The Church in Promise

(Genesis 12:1-3)

- A. God would establish the descendants of Abraham as a nation in the land of Canaan for the purpose of bring blessing salvation to all mankind (Gal. 3:26-29).
- B. Because of their sins, Israel forfeited their right to these promises; thus, the coming of the Messiah became their judgment.
 - 1. They lost their right to the land...
 - 2. They lost their identity as a nation...
 - 3. They lost their salvation by rejecting the Son of God...
- C. This promise of salvation included the establishment of the church.
 - 1. Amos 9:11-12; Acts 15:13-17
 - 2. Isaiah 49:6; Acts 13:46-49
 - 3. Isaiah 66:18-24; 1 Peter 2:9-10
- D. Ephesians 2:11-17
- III. The Church in Prophecy
 - A. An eternal kingdom (2 Samuel 7:12-16; 1 Tim. 3:15; Matt. 16:18-19; 1 Pet. 2:5; Heb. 1:5; Luke 1:31-33; Heb. 12:28-29; Daniel 2:44)
 - B. Established during the Roman Empire (Dan. 2:44; Luke 2:1)
 - C. Established in Jerusalem (Isaiah 2:1-4; Luke 24:46-49; Acts 1:8; 2:5)
 - D. Established with power (Joel 2:28-32; Acts 2:1-4)
- IV. The Church in Preparation

(Matthew 3:1-17)

- A. Before Pentecost, the kingdom is always referred to as coming in the future.
- B. In the time of John the Baptist and Jesus, the kingdom was "at hand."
- V. The Church in Perfection

(Acts 2)

- A. On the Day of Pentecost, the church came into existence in perfection by the miraculous power of the Holy Spirit.
- B. After Pentecost, the kingdom is always referred to as existing (Col. 1:13; 4:11; 1 Thes. 2:12; Heb. 12:28; Rev. 1:9).
