THE CHURCH THE CALLED OUT

Introduction:

- The New Testament uses many terms and concepts to describe the church of Christ. 1.
- 2. As members of the church, it is important for us to know what the church is - and what the Lord expects it to be.
- 3. Thus, as we study these divine descriptions of the church, we will learn how we are to conduct ourselves individually and as a congregation of God's people.
- 4. Before we discuss the specific terms of designation, there are a few fundamental facts that must be considered.
- 5. First, we must understand the role of the church in God's plan of redemption...
 - Eternal purpose a.
 - Connected to the crucifixion b.
 - Result of the resurrection C.
 - d. Established on Pentecost
- I. Called Out of the World
 - The Greek word that is translated as 'church' is *ekklesia* (εκκλησια). Α.
 - 1. This word means, "A calling out; called out; a gathering of citizens called out from their homes into some public place, an assembly."
 - 2. In relation to the Christian, this word has a deeper and spiritual meaning.
 - 3. It refers to those who have been called out of sin and into fellowship with God
 - 4. As a group, they assemble to worship God and to edify and enjoy fellowship with one another.
 - Thus, the church is a body of believers, not a building or meeting place 5. (cf. Matt. 18:17; Acts 5:11; 8:1; 11:22, 26; 1 Cor. 1:2; 4:17; etc.).
 - Β. The church is made up of Christians who have been called out of darkness (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. Eph. 5:8, 11).
 - To be called out of darkness is to be removed from the power and realm of Satan C. (Col. 1:13; Acts 26:18).
 - Thus, it is to be called out of the world (cf. John 14:30; 15:19; 17:14-16; 18:36; D. Rom. 12:2; Gal. 1:4; 6:14; Jam. 4:4; 2 Pet. 2:20; 1 John 2:15-17).
- II. Called Into the Church
 - (1 Peter 2:5, 10)When one is called out of the world, he is called into the Lord's church. A.
 - There are only two kingdoms that exist in the universe the kingdom of Satan B. and the kingdom of God.
 - C. Those called out of darkness are called into light; those who were not a people become the people of God (1 Pet. 2:9-10).
 - The people of God are described as living stones that make up a spiritual house D. (1 Pet. 2:5).
 - E. The Christian must learn to appreciate the true nature of the church.
- III. Called by the Gospel

(1 Peter 1:22 - 2:3)

(1 Peter 2:9)

- The way one is called out of the world and into the church is by the Gospel of Α. Christ.
- Β. Souls are purified from sin by obeying the truth – the Gospel.

Biblical Description of the Church

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1 Peter 2:4-10

- C. This obedience results in "being born again" sins removed in baptism (cf. John 3:3-5).
- D. Thus, the child of God must continue to intensely crave the pure Word of God.
- E. God continues to call and to guide by means of His Word.
- F. Fellowship is maintained by learning and obeying His Word (cf. 2 Pet. 2:20-22).
