Profound Principles

Text: Genesis 4:1-8

Introduction:

- 1. The story of Cain and Abel introduces a number of "firsts" into the world: the first birth, the first siblings, the first murder.
- 2. However, there are also some important principles set forth in this story.
- 3. These principles have stood from the dawn of time until now.
- I. The Importance of Worship (Genesis 4:3-7)
 - A. Both Cain and Abel brought an offering unto the Lord.
 - B. However, God accepted only Abel's offering.
 - 1. Abel offered by faith (Hebrews 11:4).
 - 2. Faith comes by hearing God's Word (Romans 10:17).
 - 3. Thus, God had instructed what was to be offered.
 - C. Acceptable worship is that which is approved of God (4:7).
 - D. This important principle must be remembered today (John 4:24).
- II. The Importance of Justice (Genesis 4:8-16)
 - A. God is aware of injustice in His world.
 - B. God's justness is violated when the innocent suffer.
 - 1. Cain's motivation (1 John 3:12).
 - 2. God's indignation (Exo. 3:7; Job 16:18; Isa. 5:7; Rev. 6:10).
 - C. God will punish those who oppress the righteous.
 - D. God's justice is tempered with mercy.
- III. The Importance of Influence (Genesis 4:17-26)
 - A. Cain's influence of wickedness continued through his descendants.
 - B. Seth's influence of righteousness continued through his children.
 - C. When the wicked began to influence the righteous, the world became so filled with sin that God destroyed it (Genesis 6).
 - D. We must be aware of our influence on others and of other's influences on us.

Conclusion:
