The Sin of Nadab and Abihu

Text: Leviticus 10

1. The Sin and Its Punishment

## A. Chapters 8 – 10 of the Book of Leviticus deal with the role and duties of the priests.

- B. This section includes the sorrowful example of the sin of two priests, sons of Aaron.
- C. Nadab and Abihu offered strange fire in worship to Jehovah.
  - 1. The word for 'strange' means, "Foreign or profane."
  - 2. It was strange because God had not commanded (authorized) it.
  - 3. By specifying what fire was to be used, God excluded the use of any other type of fire.
  - 4. This principle still applies under the New Testament (cf. Col. 3:16-17).
- D. Because they rejected the authority of God, God punished them with death.
- ||. The Seriousness of Sanctification
  - A. God emphasized that He had not been held sacred by these two priests.
  - B. God is sanctified holy, set apart from all others and must be reverenced by those who would come to Him in worship.
  - C. Because the priests had been sanctified for their appointed service at the Tabernacle, they could not leave their duties or mourn as one would in such a time of sorrow.
  - D. One's holiness to God never is to be taken lightly.

- A. The priests were to make sure that nothing would impair their judgment when they were serving the Lord thus, they were not to drink wine nor strong drink.
- B. Furthermore, they needed clear thinking to be able to teach others the will of God.
- C. All Christians must remember that they are the priests of God under the New Covenant (cf. 1 Pet. 2:9; etc.).
- D. It is just as important for Christians to faithfully obey the commands of God in worship and service as it was for the Old Testament priests.
- E. We must not allow our minds to become clouded by anything that would affect our service and worship.
  - 1. Alcohol, drugs, etc.
  - 2. Pride, stubbornness, rebellion, etc.
  - 3. Error, false doctrine, false teachers, etc.
  - 4. Family, friends, preacher, etc.
- F. Just like the OT priests, it is our duty to teach God's will to others; therefore, we must study, memorize, and learn the Bible.
