## **About Influence**

## Introduction:

- 1. Around this time each year, our young people go back to school.
- 2. This series will focus on issues that we tend to think of as those facing the younger generation.
- 3. However, these matters concern all men young and old, children and adults.
- 4. Often, adults will go back to school to continue their education.
- 5. Sometimes, in our spiritual lives, we need to go back to school and reflect upon the teaching of Scripture.
- I. Everyone Has an Influence
  - A. The World's Bible
  - B. Someone is always watching us, especially if they know we are a Christian.
  - C. We can be an influence for good.
    - 1. Deliberately (John 1:40-42)
    - 2. Unintentionally (Genesis 13:7; Acts 16:23-24)
  - D. We can be an influence for evil.
    - 1. Deliberately (1 Kings 14:16; John 12:42) { 17 times / 16 Jeroboam}
    - 2. Unintentionally (2 Samuel 11:2)
  - E. But, we will be an influence.
- II. Everyone Has a Responsibility
  - A. The principle of stewardship
    - 1. With great blessings come great responsibilities.
    - 2. Stewards are given the duty of caring for someone else's riches (cf. Matthew 20:8; Luke 16:1-2).
    - 3. Christians are stewards of God's blessings (Titus 1:7; 1 Peter 4:10).
    - 4. A steward must be faithful in his duties (1 Cor. 4:1-2; Luke 12:42-46).
  - B. We have great responsibilities to God.
    - 1. In worship and fellowship (John 4:24; Hebrews 10:25)
    - 2. But also in the world (Matthew 5:16)
  - C. We must be faithful stewards of our influence.
    - 1. Always do what is right even when you think no one is looking.
    - 2. Always set a good example (1 Timothy 4:12; Titus 2:6-8).
    - 3. Love your friends (Mark 5:19; John 15:13; Acts 10:24; Gal. 4:16).
    - 4. Love your enemies (Matthew 5:43-44; Romans 12:20; 5:10).
- III. Everyone Has a Community
  - A. God created man to be a social creature (Genesis 2:18).
  - B. We all need friends.
  - C. But, we must be careful of the influence other have upon us.
  - D. What is a true friend?
    - 1. One who loves us and seeks our best (Prov. 17:17; 27:6; 2 Kin. 5:13)
    - 2. One who strengthens and encourages (Prov. 27:9; 1 Sam. 23:15-18)
    - 3. One who helps us get to Heaven (Prov. 18:24; John 15:14)
  - E. We tend to act like those we associate with (1 Cor. 15:33; Prov. 13:20).

Lesson One

- 1. We must choose our friends wisely.
- 2. We must choose our dates wisely.
- 3. We must choose our heroes (mentors) wisely.
- 4. THE CHURCH MUST BE FRIENDLY!
- F. Remember, it is easier to be pulled by another than it is to pull another up (Galatians 6:1).
