BALAAM

Who Loved the Wages of Unrighteousness

Introduction:

- 1. Romans 15:4 "whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning."
- 2. We should pay close attention to the story of Balaam and Balak...
- I. The Hypocrisy of Balaam (Numbers 22:1–38)
 - A. Balak, king of Moab, feared the nation of Israel (vs. 1-4).
 - B. Thus, he sought to hire Balaam to curse them (vs. 5-7).
 - C. But, the Lord told Balaam not to go to Balak (vs. 8-14).
 - 1. Notice what God says to Balaam in verse 12.
 - 2. Notice what Balaam tells the men in verse 13.
 - 3. He did not tell the whole story in order to leave the door open...
 - D. So, Balak tried again to persuade Balaam to curse Israel (vs. 15-18).
 - E. Then, Balaam tried to seek approval from God (vs. 19-20).
 - 1. In spite of his bold statement in verse 18, Balaam wants the reward of money and power.
 - 2. Notice God's "if" in verse 20.
 - 3. Notice Balaam's eagerness in verse 21 literally, "he went by his own mind (or will)."
 - F. Balaam willfully rebelled against God's command (vs. 21).
 - G. Thus, God's anger was manifested against Balaam (vs. 22-35).
 - H. Balaam finally came to Balak with the warning that he could only speak God's will (vs. 36-38).
- II. The Blessing of Balaam (Numbers 22:39 24:25)
 - A. Three times Balak asked Balaam to curse the children of Israel.
 - B. Three times God turned his desire to curse Israel into a blessing (cf. Deut. 23:3-5; Josh. 24:8-10; Nehemiah 13:1-2).
 - C. In fact, God even gave a Messianic prophecy through Balaam (vs. 15-25)!
 - D. Thus, Balaam did not receive the reward he desires (vs. 10-11).
- III. The Error of Balaam (Numbers 31:13-16)
 - A. Though Balaam had obeyed the Lord in speaking the inspired blessings over Israel, he was still trying to please Balak.
 - B. Thus, he advised Balak on how to defeat Israel by causing them to sin.
 - C. Balaam was greedy and rebellious (Jude 11).
 - 1. He would speak whatever brought him the most profit.
 - 2. Jude declares that false teachers in his day possessed the same attitude.
 - D. Balaam loved the wages of unrighteousness (2 Peter 2:12-16).
 - 1. He had forsaken the straight way for the love of money.
 - 2. Peter says that false teachers in his day did the same.
 - E. Balaam set a trap for the children of Israel (Revelation 2:14).
 - 1. He helped Balak place a stumbling block before them.
 - 2. He helped ensnare them in idolatry.
 - 3. He helped ensnare them in fornication.

- F. Balaam teaches us many lessons...
 - 1. There are wolves in sheep's clothing (Matthew 7:15).
 - 2. It is impossible to serve both God and mammon (Matthew 6:24).
 - 3. To die the death of the righteous, one must live the life of the righteous (Numbers 23:10; Revelation 14:13).
 - 4. One who lives with the wicked will die among them (Numbers 31:8; Joshua 13:22).
 - 5. One must never waver from the Truth of God's Word (Prov. 23:23).
 - 6. The Truth must be preached (2 Timothy 4:1-2).
 - 7. The Truth must be defended (Jude 3).
 - 8. We must be careful not to cause another to stumble.

Conclusion:

- 1. May we learn from Balaam the need to submit our will to the Father's.
- 2. May we learn the seriousness of causing others to sin.
- 3. May we learn to treasure God above the riches of this world.
