- I. What the Blood of Christ Will Not Do
 - A. It will not cleanse one without faith (Hebrews 11:6).
 - B. It will not save one in sin (Acts 17:30-31).
 - C. It will not cleanse before obedience (Acts 26:28; 22:16).
 - D. It will not save one out of Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).
 - E. It will not save one out of the church (Acts 2:47).
 - F. It will not make one a member of a denomination (Acts 20:28).
 - 1. 1 Corinthians 1:10; John 17:20-21
 - 2. It will not give one a denominational name (Acts 4:12).
 - 3. It will not obligate one to a denominational program (Gal. 5:1).

II. What the Blood of Christ Will Do

- A. It will remit one's sins (Matthew 26:28; Hebrews 9:22).
- B. It will wash away one's sinful past (Romans 3:25; Revelation 1:5; 7:14).
- C. It will justify one from sin (Romans 5:9).
- D. It will redeem and forgive (Ephesians 1:7; Colossians 1:14; Hebrews 9:12; 1 Peter 1:18-19).
- E. It will purge and cleanse (Hebrews 9:14; 1 John 1:7).
- F. It will sanctify (Hebrews 13:12).
- G. It will create fellowship with God and man (1 Cor. 10:16; Eph. 2:13-16).
- H. It will make peace (Colossians 1:20).
- I. It will make one a perfect and able worker (Hebrews 13:20-21).
- J. It will lead one to Heaven (Hebrews 10:15-20; Revelation 12:10-11).

III. How to Contact the Blood of Christ

- A. It cannot be contacted...
 - 1. In disobedience or rebellion
 - 2. By faith only
 - 3. By repentance only
 - 4. By baptism only
 - 5. At the mourner's bench
 - 6. In denominationalism
- B. It is contacted by knowing the truth (John 8:32).
- C. It is contacted by faith that works (James 2:24).
- D. It is contacted in obedience (Romans 6:18).
- E. It is contacted by baptism of the penitent believer (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; Romans 6:3-4).
- F. It continues to be contacted by walking in the light (1 John 1:7).
- G. It continues to be contacted in the church (Ephesians 2:16).
