## Do I Love the Truth?

## A Study in Second Thessalonians

## Introduction:

- 1. This book was written to a church with questions about the Truth.
- 2. Paul describes four groups of people and their relationships to the Truth.
- It all comes down to a matter of love for God and His Truth...
- I. Those Who Reject the Truth
  - A. Second Thessalonians 1:6-9
  - B. There are some who "obey not the Gospel."
    - 1. Thus, they are not saved (Heb. 5:9).
    - 2. Hearing is not enough (Matt. 7:21).
  - C. Their fate is judgment, punishment and everlasting destruction.
- II. Those Who Change the Truth
  - A. Second Thessalonians 2:1-5, 11-12
  - B. There are some who believe a perverted version of the Truth.
    - 1. Traditions of men (Matt. 15:1-3, 8-9).
    - 2. Pleasing men instead of God (Gal. 1:6-10).
  - C. Their fate is to be consumed, destroyed and to perish (2:8-10).
- III. Those Who Obey the Truth
  - A. Second Thessalonians 2:13 3:2
  - B. This is because the love the Truth (2:10).
    - 1. They believed the Truth (2:13).
    - 2. They obeyed the Truth (2:14).
    - 3. They remained in the Truth (2:15).
    - 4. The spread the Truth (3:1-2).
  - C. Their fate is to endure (1:4), to glorify (1:10-12) and to be saved (2:10, 13-14).
- IV. Those Who Abandon the Truth
  - A. Second Thessalonians 3:6, 11-15
  - B. There are some who obey the Gospel then later abandon it.
    - 1. They become unruly, out of step (3:6).
    - 2. They become negligent of work (3:11).
    - 3. They become meddlesome (3:11).
    - 4. They become disobedient, rebellious (3:14).
  - C. Their fate is shame, admonishment and separation.

## Conclusion:

- 1. Every person is in one of these four groups.
- 2. In which group are you found?
- 3. The answer depends on whether or not you love the Truth.
