THE POWER OF MEMORIZATION

Text: Psalm 119:11

Introduction:

- 1. God expects His people to hide His word in their hearts.
- 2. The word for 'hide' means, "To store up; to treasure; to hoard; to protect."
- 3. The way to store up God's word in one's heart is by memorizing it.
- 4. Many claim that they do not have the ability to memorize Scripture.
- 5. However, God created our minds with the ability to remember a great number of things for a long period of time.
 - a. Environmental memory
 - b. Short-term memory
 - c. Long-term memory
 - i. Process memory
 - ii. Declarative memory
 - iii. Foundational memory (association)
- 6. Often, what we call a poor memory is actually a lack of understanding of the function of memory.
- 7. Storing Scripture in one's long-term memory is possible if one understands the process of memorization and exercises the brain accordingly.
- 8. However, before engaging in the process, one must understand the purpose.
- I. Obedience

(Deuteronomy 6:4-9)

- A. God commands His people to keep His word in their hearts.
- B. We take for granted that everyone can have a copy of the Bible with them at all times in print or on their phones.
 - 1. But, it was not always so.
 - 2. And, this does not fulfill the command of God.
- C. His word is to be in our hearts, not our hands!
- II. Preparation

(Matthew 13:52)

- A. By memorizing God's word, one prepares himself for whatever he may face in life.
- B. His mind becomes a storehouse of treasures both old and new.
- III. Protection

(Psalm 119:11; 37:31; Matt. 4:1-11)

- A. The memorizing of God's word helps to protect one from sin.
- B. He is able to recognize temptation to evil.
- C. He is able answer the temptation with Truth.
- D. He is able to find the way of escape (cf. 1 Cor. 10:13).
- IV. Defense

(1 Peter 3:15)

- A. By memorizing God's word, one is ready to give a defense of Truth when challenged.
- B. The "sword of the Spirit" cannot be used if it is not carried into battle!

V. Education

(Judges 2:10; Deut. 6:7)

- A. By memorizing Scripture, one is able to teach it to others.
- B. The failure of Israel was a failure of learning and teaching the truth.

VI. Prosperity

(Psalm 1; Joshua 1:8)

- A. Memorizing God's word enables one to prosper in his life.
- B. Spiritual prosperity is of greater value than material wealth.

VII. Maturity

(Romans 12:2; Colossians 3:16)

- A. Memorizing Scripture results in the renewing of one's mind, leading to a transformation in life.
- B. The mature Christian will have the word of Christ dwelling in him richly abundantly, copiously.
