
The Book of Joshua

The Battle for Canaan The Northern Campaign

Text: Joshua 11 - 12

- I. The Northern Alliance (Joshua 11:1-5)
 - A. After hearing about what had happened in the south, the kingdoms of northern Canaan sought to defeat Israel.
 - B. Thus, they banded together and met at Merom to fight against Israel.
 - 1. Jabin is a title worn by leaders in that city (cf. Judges 4:2) meaning, "the wise" or "intelligent."
 - 2. Hazor (meaning, "fortified" or "enclosed") was a stronghold in that region of Canaan.
 - 3. They would not be completely defeated until the time of Deborah and Barak (Judges 4:23).



- C. Chinneroth (also spelled Chinnereth [13:27]) is another name for the Sea of Galilee, also called Gennesaret (Luke 5:1).
 - 1. It was the name of a city that, in turn, gave the name to the lake.
 - 2. It was located just south of the Sea, where the Jordan River flows out of the larger body of water.
- D. The waters of Merom refer to a smaller lake located north of the Sea of Galilee, created by the swelling of the Jordan River.
- E. This fighting force was large and equipped with horses and chariots the first time they would be used against Israel in Canaan.

II. The Victory of Israel

(Joshua 11:6-15)

- A. God promised to be with Joshua and Israel, and to give them victory over their enemies.
- B. They were not to be afraid of the number or weapons of their enemies.
 - 1. To hough a horse was to cut its back legs and hamstrings so that it was unable to run (or pull a chariot).
 - 2. Often, when this was done, the arteries were also cut, causing the animal's death.
- C. Israel launched a surprise attack on their enemies and they began to flee immediately.
- D. Israel pursued them and defeated them, just as God had promised.
- E. Thus, they took the cities of the north, burning only the city of Hazor.
- F. Great spoils were taken by the Israelites.
- G. Joshua had been obedient to the will of God (commanded by Moses); thus, God had granted victory to His people.
