The Sinner's Prayer

Introduction:

- 1. Denominational teaching concerning the "sinner's prayer"...
- 2. Billy Graham's version: "O God, I acknowledge that I have sinned against You. I am sorry for my sins. I am willing to turn from my sins. I openly receive and acknowledge Jesus Christ as my Savior. I confess Him as Lord. From this moment on I want to live for Him and serve Him. In Jesus' name. Amen."
- 3. But, is this teaching this prayer biblical?

I. The Wrong Passages

- A. Revelation 3:20
 - 1. 3:14, 22 Addressed to the church, not alien sinners.
 - 2. 3:19 Members of the church needed to repent.
- B. First John 1:9
 - 1. 2:1 Addressed to Christians.
 - 2. 1:7 Confession of sins is part of walking in the light.
- C. Acts 8:20-24
 - 1. 8:5-6, 12-13 Simon was a Christian! (Cf. Mk. 16:16; Ac. 2:38)
 - 2. This is God's plan for forgiveness of a Christian who stumbles.
- D. Acts 10:1-4, 31
 - 1. 10:5-6 Cornelius needed to hear what he ought to do.
 - 2. 11:13-14 Cornelius was not saved by prayer.
 - 3. 10:47-48 Obedience resulted in salvation (cf. Mk. 16:16).
- E. Acts 9:11
 - 1. 9:10-12 The answer to Saul's prayer was the sending of a preacher
 - 2. 9:6; 22:10-16 Saul need to hear what to do to be saved.

II. The Wrong Plan

- A. Under Christ's New Covenant, no alien sinner was ever commanded to pray in order to receive forgiveness of sins.
- B. Instead, a submissive and obedient faith is required...
 - 1. Hear *Romans* 10:17
 - 2. Believe *John 8:24*
 - 3. Repent Acts 17:30
 - 4. Confess Faith Romans 10:10
 - 5. Be Baptized Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; 22:16; Gal. 3:27; 1 Pet. 3:21

III. The Wrong Prayer

- A. Prayed to the wrong party...
 - 1. Often, when one is encouraged to pray the sinner's prayer he or she is directed to ask Jesus to come into his or her heart.
 - 2. However, Jesus instructed His followers to pray to the Father not Him (John 14:13-14; 15:7, 16; 16:23).
- B. Prayed by the wrong person... (John 9:31; Prov. 15:29; 28:9; 1 Pet. 3:12)
