PRAYER OF PRAISE (Isaiah 40:28; Genesis 1 – 2)

# PRAISE GOD FOR HIS CREATIVE POWER

"Hast thou not known? hast thou not heard, *that* the everlasting God, the LORD, the Creator of the ends of the earth, fainteth not, neither is weary? *there is* no searching of his understanding."

Isaiah 40:28

## PRAYER FOR SPIRITUAL NEEDS (Mark 12:30; Philippians 1:9-11)

#### PRAY FOR LOVE

"And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment."
