### PRAYER OF PRAISE

(Exodus 3:14)

# PRAISE GOD FOR HIS SELF-EXISTENCE

"And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hat sent me unto you."

Exodus 3:14

God is a self-existent being. This means that He has no beginning and no end – no creator. God simply is. "I AM THAT I AM" means that God is ever in the present – eternally existing. He is not dependent upon anyone or anything for His existence, power, or wisdom.

In prayer, let us seek to honor God as self-existent and eternal. Let us come before Him with humility and reverence. Yet, let us pray with confidence – for God is able to hear and answer our prayers.

### PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH

(Acts 5:1)

### PRAY FOR THE FEAR OF THE CHURCH

"And great fear came upon all the church, and upon as many as heard these things."

Acts 5:11

Fear is a sense of reverence and respect for God. To fear God, one must acknowledge His greatness and His holiness. When God is feared, sin is shunned.

Let us pray for the fear of the church – locally and worldwide. Pray that God's people will show the proper reverence toward God – when we worship and when we serve. If Christians do not respect God, how can the world ever learn to reverence Him? Pray for the church to learn, accept, and follow the will of God.

# PRAYER FOR OTHERS

(Matthew 5:44; Luke 6:28)

### **PRAY FOR ENEMIES**

"But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you."

Matthew 5:44
