PRAYER OF PRAISE

(Nahum 1:3)

PRAISE GOD FOR HIS PATIENCE

"The LORD is slow to anger, and great in power, and will not at all acquit the wicked: the LORD hath his way in the whirlwind and in the storm, and in the clouds are the dust of his feet."

Nahum 1:3

God is a God of patience. All should be thankful that He is "slow to anger." God allows us time to learn the error of our ways and to repent and seek forgiveness. However, He is great in power and – one day – will punish the wicked.

PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH

(Romans 16:4)

PRAY FOR THE GRATITUDE OF THE CHURCH

"Greet Priscilla and Aquila my helpers in Christ Jesus: Who have for my life laid down their own necks: unto whom not only I give thanks, but also all the churches of the Gentiles."

Romans 16:3-4

When one stands for the Truth, teaches the lost, does the work of the church, remains faithful during tests and trials, or serves God in any way, all other Christians should give thanks!

PRAYER FOR OTHERS

(1 Thessalonians 5:14; Romans 15:1)

PRAY FOR THE SPIRITUALLY WEAK

"We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, and not to please ourselves."

Romans 15:1

The spiritually weak are those without strength. Perhaps they are new converts who are just beginning to grow. Maybe they are those facing difficult trials that hinder their growth. PRAYER FOR PHYSICAL NEEDS

(Psalm 33:18-19; 34:10)

PRAY FOR FOOD

"Behold, the eye of the LORD is upon them that fear him, upon them that hope in his mercy; To deliver their soul from death, and to keep them alive in famine."

Psalm 33:18-19

We must pray for our food – our daily bread. Yet, we must remember that God already knows of our need. And, we must trust His promise to provide. If we seek Him first, we will not lack.

PRAYER FOR FORGIVENESS

(Colossians 1:12-14)

"Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son: In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins."

PRAYER FOR SPIRITUAL NEEDS

(Colossians 1:23; Hebrews 3:6)

PRAY FOR HOPE

"If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven, whereof I Paul am made a minister..."

Colossians 1:23
