# PRAISE GOD FOR HIS GENEROSITY

# PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH

(Ephesians 3:21)

#### PRAY FOR THE WORSHIP OF THE CHURCH

Ephesians 3:21

The church is the place where God is glorified. It is both a privilege and responsibility to be allowed to offer worship unto God. # PRAYER FOR SPIRITUAL NEEDS

(1 Thes. 4:1; Galatians 6:9-10; Colossians 4:3)

#### PRAY FOR WORK

"And let us not be weary in well-doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith."

Galatians 6:9-10
