#### PRAYER OF PRAISE

(Exodus 15:22-26)

# PRAISE GOD FOR HIS HEALING

"...If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the LORD thy God, and wilt do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the LORD that healeth thee."

Exodus 15:26

## PRAY FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CHURCH

#### **PRAY FOR MEEKNESS**

"Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? Let him show out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom."

Meekness refers to strength that is under control. It is not weakness. It is the strength of one's convictions displayed in a kind and gentle manner.
