Text: Genesis 11:1-9

## Introduction:

- 1. Following the destruction of the Flood, the descendants of Noah began to spread throughout the world.
- 2. God's promise to never again flood the world with water (evidenced by the rainbow) was a comfort to them.
- 3. However, on the plains of Shinar, a rebellion was about to begin...
- I. The Sin of Shinar (Genesis 11:1-4)
  - A. Pride
    - 1. "Let us make us a name..."
    - 2. They desired to reach heaven with their tower.
  - B. Idolatry Man's plan instead of God's plan.
  - C. Disobedience
    - 1. Genesis 8:17; 9:1, 7; 10:32
    - 2. They were commanded to fill the earth; yet they built this tower to keep from being "scattered abroad."
  - D. Their lack of faith in God and His care for them was their great sin.
- II. The Power of Unity (Genesis 11:5-9)
  - A. One language.
  - B. One people.
  - C. No restraint but their own imagination!
  - D. In order to stop them, God removed their ability to communicate.
- III. The Lessons of Babel
  - A. God's way is right and must be obeyed.
  - B. False unity brings disastrous results.
    - 1. Their unity was based on error, not truth.
    - 2. Though powerful, God defeated it.
  - C. True unity is unstoppable.
    - 1. One language (1 Corinthians 1:10; Romans 15:5-6).
    - 2. One people (Acts 4:31-32).
    - 3. No restraint (Philippians 4:13; Romans 8:31).

Conclusion: The Tower of Babel was a testament to man's pride and unity in rebellion against God. In the end, God accomplished His will in spite of man's opposition.
