THE PSALMS OF DAVID PART 3

Introduction:

- There are many different types of psalms. 1.
- Psalms 120 134 are titled as "Songs of Degrees." 2.
- The Hebrew word for 'degrees' means, "A journey to a higher place; elevation, ascent; 3. step or stairs."
- 4. These psalms were sung as the children of Israel left their homes and traveled to Jerusalem for the annual feast days.
- Only four are specified as being written by David, but he may have penned more of 5. them.
- Ι. Departing from the World
 - The psalmist cried unto the Lord and was heard. A.
 - Β. He was surrounded by deceitful, slanderous men who would not allow him to be a peace.
 - C. Thus, he long to leave this behind and journey to the Lord's house.
- II. Looking to the Lord
 - As they journey begins, one could look into the distance and see the hills where Α. the house of the Lord stood.
 - The eternal God never slumbered in protecting and preserving His people. Β.
 - C. They would come to His house to worship and honor Him.
- III. Reioicing for Fellowship
 - (Psalm 122) There was great joy when the time came to travel to the Temple in Jerusalem.
 - Α. Β. Because of the presence of God's house, they sought and prayed for peace and prosperity in the land.

IV. Pleading for Mercy

- (Psalm 123) The eyes of the psalmist were fixed above the hills, on the true house of God Α. in the heavens.
- He cried for mercy in the midst of a profane people. Β.

V. Remembering Great Deliverance

(Psalm 124)

(Psalm 125)

- As they journeyed, they reflected over the many victories God had provided for Α. them throughout their history.
- Thus, they were filled with gratitude as they came to worship Him. Β.
- VI. Abiding in Safety
 - As the mountains around Jerusalem came into closer view, they illustrated the Α. protection of God.
 - Β. They asked for God to do good to those who were upright in heart.
- VII. **Reflecting on Freedom**

(Psalm 126)

- God's great deliverances of Israel were so mighty that it seemed like a dream! Α.
- Β. In times of sorrow, continue serving by sowing - and a harvest will be reaped in joy (cf. Gal. 6:9).

- VIII. Building with the Lord
 - (Psalm 127) God's house was built and protected according to His plan; for, without Him, all would have been in vain.
 - Β. Likewise, men must involve the Lord in the building of their homes.
- IX. Walking with the Lord
 - Α. Living with reverence toward God in obedience to His will brings blessings.
 - Β. The nation would continue for generations if they would walk with Jehovah.
- Х. Trusting in the Lord
 - Though often attacked, they were never defeated. Α.
 - Β. God is righteous to deliver the faithful and defeat the wicked.
- XI. Hoping in the Lord
 - (Psalm 130) In the deep and dark valleys, one might lose sight of the mountains of Α. Jerusalem.
 - Β. Yet, with perseverance, patience, and hope, the goal would be reached.
 - C. The spiritual lesson is profound: never lose hope in God, for He gives mercy and forgiveness.
- XII. Humbling before the Lord
 - One who is humble before God realizes that there are things beyond his limited Α. knowledge or wisdom.
 - Β. Thus, he calmly trusts in the Lord with an enduring hope.
- XIII. **Recalling Faithful David**

David labored with sacrificial devotion to see that the Lord's house was built.

- A. Β. Israel begged God to remember David and His promise to David.
- C. Thus, they would be blessed.
- XIV. Dwelling in Unity
 - Both the journey and the arrival in Jerusalem demonstrated unity. Α.
 - Β. It is good and pleasant for God's people to live in unity!

XV. Blessing the Lord

Α.

- The night watchmen are encouraged to bless the Lord.
- Β. God is worthy of praise both day and night forever.
- C. The Temple guards replied, "The Lord that made heaven and earth bless thee out of Zion."
