The Gifts of Wise Men

Text: Matthew 2:1-12

Introduction:

- 1. Christmas is not the birth of Christ.
- 2. However, it is a time of year when many reflect upon the birth of the Savior.
- 3. It is also a time of giving gifts to friends and loved ones.
- 4. We are reminded of the three gifts given by the wise men to young child, Jesus.
- 5. We learn from the gifts of wise men what we must give the Lord today...

I. The Gold of Sacrifice

- A. Gold has always been a symbol of prosperity and riches (cf. Genesis 13:2; 41:42).
- B. It is also a measure of currency for buying the necessities of life.
- C. Thus, the giving of gold to someone was to make a sacrifice of something precious out of a desire to please another.
 - 1. As Israel did for the Temple (Exo. 25:3; 35:22; 1 Kings 6:21-22)
 - 2. As the Jews did for one another (Ezra 1:4, 6)
- D. We, too, must be willing to sacrifice that which is most precious to us in order to serve the Lord.
 - 1. Money 1 Timothy 6:6-10, 17-19; 2 Cor. 8:1-5, 9; 9:6-7
 - 2. Time Romans 13:11-12; Ephesians 5:15-16
 - 3. Family Matthew 10:34-37
 - 4. Self Matthew 10:38; Galatians 2:205. Life Matthew 10:39; Revelation 2:10
- E. Gold is a gift suitable for a king.

II. The Frankincense of Worship

- A. Frankincense is a white resin acquired by making an incision in the Boswellia tree and collecting the sap or gum that is expelled.
 - 1. The word "frankincense" comes from the French for "pure incense."
 - 2. It freely gives off a fragrant odor when burned.
 - 3. It is said to burn with a steady flame for long periods of time.
- B. Frankincense was used in three ways in worship to God at the Temple.
 - 1. First, it was used in meat offerings (Leviticus 2:1-3).
 - 2. Second, it was used in the showbread (Leviticus 24:6-8).
 - 3. Third, it was burned as incense in worship to God (Exodus 30:1, 7-8, 34). *{This was symbolic of prayer.}*
- C. Thus, frankincense was not only an expensive gift, but also one that was symbolic of their worship of the Savior.
- D. We, too, must be willing to give the Lord the worship due His holy name.
 - 1. John 4:24 in the way He desires
 - 2. Matthew 15:8-9 not according to man's traditions
 - 3. Hebrews 10:25 with a right attitude
- E. Frankincense is a gift suitable for God.

III. The Myrrh of Submission

- A. Myrrh is a similar substance to frankincense and procured in a similar way.
- B. However, it is bitter to taste and used as a stupefying drug and in the process of embalming the dead (Mark 15:23; John 19:39).
- C. Myrrh was a costly gift, but also one that symbolized the sufferings to be endured by the Lord.
- D. We, too, must be willing to give the Lord our complete submission to Him since He submitted Himself to the cross for us.
 - 1. Mark 12:30 my heart (Acts 8:37; 11:23)
 - 2. Matthew 6:10 my will (John 4:34; 1 Peter 4:1-2)
 - 3. 2 Corinthians 5:15 my life (Romans 12:1-2)
 - 4. Revelation 12:10-11 my all (Revelation 2:10)
- E. Myrrh is a gift suitable for the sufferings of man.

Conclusion:

- 1. As we give gifts during this time of year, let us make sure we are giving to the Lord.
- 2. We owe Him the Gold of Sacrifice, the Frankincense of Worship, and the Myrrh of Submission.
