THE LEGACY OF DAVID**PART 3 – DAVID: A TYPE OF CHRIST**

- I. Both Born in Bethlehem
 - A. David (Ruth 1:19; 2:4; 4:11, 17, 21-22; 1 Samuel 16:1; 17:12, 58; 20:6)
 - B. Jesus (Micah 5:2; Matthew 2:1ff; Luke 2:1-7; John 7:42)
- II. Both Named with Significance
 - A. David means, “Beloved” or “Well beloved.”
 - B. Jesus is God’s beloved Son (Matthew 3:17; 12:18; 17:5).
- III. Both Were Obedient Children
 - A. David was born of humble parents and submitted to them (1 Samuel 16:7, 11; 17:20).
 - B. Jesus was born of humble parents and submitted to them (Luke 2:46-52).
- IV. Both Were Sacrificial Shepherds
 - A. David risked his life for the sheep (1 Samuel 16:11; 17:31-36, 49).
 - B. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, gave His life for the sheep (John 10:2, 11, 27-29; Isaiah 53).
- V. Both Had Faithful Hearts
 - A. David was a man after God’s own heart (1 Sam. 13:14; Ac. 13:22; 1 Kin. 15:3ff).
 - B. Jesus was a man after God’s own heart (John 6:38; Hebrews 10:9; etc.).
- VI. Both Were Anointed by God
 - A. David received the Holy Spirit (1 Samuel 16:13; cf. Acts 1:16).
 - B. David was anointed by Samuel to be King (1 Samuel 16:13).
 - C. Jesus received the Holy Spirit (Matthew 3:16; John 3:34).
 - D. Jesus was anointed by God to be King (Acts 10:38; Colossians 1:13-14).
- VII. Both Reigned as King
 - A. David was made king according to God’s plan (1 Samuel 16:6-7).
 - B. David was elevated from lowly status to the throne (Psalm 78:70-71).
 - C. David was king over physical Israel.
 - D. David reigned as king for 40 years (1 Kings 2:11).
 - E. Jesus was made King according to God’s plan (Psalm 132:11; Luke 1:32; Acts 2:30ff).
 - F. Jesus was elevated from lowly status to the throne (Mark 6:2-3; Phil. 2:4ff).
 - G. Jesus is King over spiritual Israel (Matthew 3:1-3; 16:18-19; Revelation 1:9).
 - H. Jesus reigns until the end of time (Revelation 17:14; 1 Corinthians 15:24-26).
- VIII. Both Were Victorious Conquerors
 - A. David fought and won physical battles (2 Samuel 3:18).
 - B. Jesus fought and won spiritual battles (1 Corinthians 15:25-26; Revelation 6:2).
- IX. Both Received Authority from God
 - A. David remained humble in spite of his authority (2 Samuel 5:10; 7:18-22; Revelation 3:7).

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- B. Jesus remained humble in spite of His authority (Ephesians 1:20-23; John 3:30; Matt. 20:26-28).
- X. Both Were Prophets of God
- A. David was God's spokesman (2 Samuel 23:1-2; Acts 1:16; 2:30).
 - B. David prophesied about Jesus (Acts 2:31; Psalm 22:1, 16, 18; 34:20; 41:9; 69:21).
 - C. Jesus was God's spokesman (Acts 3:22-23; John 12:49-50).
 - D. Jesus fulfilled David's prophecies (Luke 24:44; Mark 15:34; John 13:18; 19:24, 29, 36; 20:27).
- XI. Both Were Men of Faith
- A. David was a man of prayer (1 Samuel 30:6; Psalm 55:17).
 - B. David was a man of trust (2 Samuel 22:2-3; Psalm 23).
 - C. David was a man of courage (1 Samuel 17:46).
 - D. Jesus was a man of prayer (Luke 6:12; 22:44; etc.).
 - E. Jesus was a man of trust (John 8:28-29).
 - F. Jesus was a man of courage (Mark 1:27; 1 John 3:8).
- XII. Both Suffered Greatly in Life
- A. David was rejected – a man of sorrows (1 Samuel 20:3; Psalm 6:7; 69:20).
 - B. Jesus was rejected – a man of sorrows (John 1:11; 11:54; Acts 3:18; Isaiah 53).
- XIII. Both Were Faithful in Obedience
- A. David behaved wisely (1 Samuel 18:14-15; Psalm 34:3).
 - B. David executed both justice and mercy (1 Samuel 30:23-26; 1 Chronicles 18:14).
 - C. David knew God was with him (Acts 7:46).
 - D. Jesus behaved wisely (Colossians 2:3; Luke 11:31; Matthew 6:9).
 - E. Jesus executed both justice and mercy (John 7:24; 8:7; Matthew 22:16, 21).
 - F. Jesus knew God was with Him (John 8:29; 16:32).
- XIV. Both Were Saviors of God's People
- A. David was a savior of Israel (2 Samuel 19:9; 21:17; Isaiah 55:3).
 - B. Jesus is the Savior of all (Galatians 3:26-29; Matthew 16:18; Ephesians 5:8, 23; Acts 13:23-34).
- XV. Both Died in Hope of Heaven
- A. David died with hope of a coming Savior (Acts 2:25-28; 13:36; Heb. 11:32, 40).
 - B. David longed for Heaven (Psalm 42:1-2)
 - C. Jesus died with hope of resurrection (Luke 23:46; Acts 2:29-33).
 - 1. He had finished His work (John 17:4-5).
 - 2. He died to give hope to others (1 Peter 1:21).
 - D. Jesus longed for Heaven (John 17:5).
- XVI. Both Had a Powerful Influence after Their Deaths
- A. David became the standard of Israel (1 Kings 11:34)
 - B. Jesus became the standard for the world (Acts 3:16; 5:14, 41; 10:43; 15:14).
