## GOD, OUR FATHER

Introduction:

1.

- God's relationship as a Father to man might be misunderstood in our culture.
  - a. Some only know a father as an abusive, cruel tyrant.
  - b. Some only know a father as a selfish, deadbeat bum.
  - c. Some do not know a father at all! {*Promiscuity, homosexuality, etc.*}
- 2. In a world that glorifies "baby-daddies" and glamorizes "shacking up," we must be reminded what a father is supposed to be.
- 3. Compare this with Paul's statement in Ephesians 5:22-33.
- 4. Let us consider what the Bible teaches about being a father.
- 5. Then, we can learn about God, our Father.
- I. A Father Is a Parent
  - A. There is more to being a parent than just genetics.
  - B. As a parent, a father is motivated by love in all that he does for his children.
    - 1. Paul uses this description for his relationship with the church in Thessalonica (1 Thessalonians 2:1, 7-12).
    - 2. Every deed done is because of a father's love for his child.
  - C. As human beings, we sometimes fail in this regard.
    - 1. We may act out of anger because we've had a bad day.
    - 2. We may act out of selfishness, jealousy, pride, etc.
  - D. God, our Father, is a perfect Parent.
    - 1. He is a perfect Creator.
    - 2. He always acts out of love (John 3:16; etc.).
    - 3. Even His anger and hate is a statement of love (cf. Deuteronomy 12:30-32; 16:22; Malachi 2:16; Psalm 119:104). {*God hates beer commercials!*}
- II. A Father Is a President
  - A. The father is the head of the house (Ephesians 5:23).
    - 1. It is this way by the design of creation (Gen. 1:27; 2:18-22).

1 Corinthians 11:3 But I would have you know, that the head of every man is Christ; and the head of the woman is the man; and the head of Christ is God.

1 Corinthians 11:8-9 For the man is not of the woman; but the woman of the man. 9 Neither was the man created for the woman; but the woman for the man.

1 Timothy 2:12-13 But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority over the man, but to be in silence. 13 For Adam was first formed, then Eve.

- 2. It is dangerous to disregard God's divine order (Genesis 3:1-13).
  - a. Sin (vs. 6)
  - b. Shame (vs. 7)
  - c. Deception (vs. 8)
  - d. Fear (vs. 9-10)
  - e. Blame (vs. 11-13)
  - f. Separation (vs. 23-24)
- B. He is responsible for his household.
  - 1. For leading his wife (Eph. 5:23-25, 28, 33; 1 Peter 3:1-7; 1 Cor. 7:3-5)

2. Therefore, wives, be in subjection (Eph. 5:21-22; Hebrews 13:17).

Hebrews 13:17 Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that is unprofitable for you.

- 3. For leading his children (Eph. 6:4; Gen. 18:19; Isaiah 38:19)
- 4. Therefore, children, obey (Eph. 6:1-3; Luke 2:51).
- C. God, our Father is a perfect President.
  - 1. He rules by right of creation.
  - 2. He has all authority. {We have stopped seeking authority for all we do.}

Colossians 3:17 And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him.

Matthew 28:19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

- III. A Father Is a Provider
  - A. He provides for the needs and necessities of his family.

1 Timothy 5:8 But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel.

2 Thessalonians 3:10 For even when we were with you, this we commanded you, that if any would not work, neither should he eat.

- B. He provides for the spiritual welfare of his family. {See above}
- C. God, our Father, is a perfect Provider.
  - 1. Creation / Garden of Eden (Genesis 1-2)
  - 2. For Israel (Isaiah 5:1-7) {"What could have been done more?"}
  - 3. Every day He blesses

Matthew 5:45 That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust.

Matthew 6:11 Give us this day our daily bread.

James 1:17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.

Psalm 145:9 The LORD is good to all: and his tender mercies are over all his works.

- 4. For salvation (John 3:16 What more could He give?)
- 5. For perfection

2 Peter 1:3 According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue:

2 Timothy 3:16-17 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: 17 That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works.

- 6. For eternity
- IV. A Father Is a Protector
  - A. He seeks to protect his children from harm.
  - B. He seeks to protect his children from sin.
    - 1. We should learn from the mistake of Lot.

Genesis 13:12 Abram dwelled in the land of Canaan, and Lot dwelled in the cities of the plain, and pitched his tent toward Sodom.

Genesis 19:8 Behold now, I have two daughters which have not known man; let me, I pray you, bring them out unto you, and do ye to them as is good in your eyes: only unto these men do nothing; for therefore came they under the shadow of my roof.

- 2. In our culture, too many "fathers" choose abortion!
- C. God, our Father, is a perfect Protector.
  - 1. He provides protection (Ephesians 6:10-18).
  - 2. He provides prayer (Matthew 6:13).
  - 3. He provides power (James 4:7; 1 Corinthians 10:13).
- V. A Father Is a Punisher
  - A. Part of being a father is disciplining one's children (Proverbs 19:18; 22:6, 15; 23:13-14; 29:15, 17).
  - B. As humans, we often make mistakes in this regard.
  - C. God, our Father, is a perfect Punisher.
    - 1. He disciplines out of love (Hebrews 12:3-13).
    - 2. He offers mercy and provides forgiveness.
    - 3. He punishes with justice (Romans 2:1-11).

## Conclusion:

- 1. If you have a good and godly earthly father, appreciate him!
- 2. If not, you can have a <u>perfect</u> Father, God in Heaven.
- 3. He will welcome you into His family with open arms (Luke 15).
