BE STRONG AND VERY COURAGEOUS

Synopsis:

- 1. In order to appreciate fully the book of Judges, one must keep in mind some background and history of the nation of Israel.
- 2. The providence of God led Jacob and his family into the land of Egypt where they were protected by the influence of Joseph.
- 3. While there, they became the nation that God had promised Abraham they would become (Deuteronomy 26:5).
- 4. Under the leadership of Moses, God delivered His people from Egypt and brought them through the wilderness to the borders of the land of Canaan.
- 5. It was under the guidance of Joshua that the nation of Israel would inherit the Promised Land by conquering the inhabitants of the land.

Introduction:

- 1. God's words to Joshua were meant to encourage him for the work of leading the children of Israel in the taking of the land of Canaan.
- 2. However, they also serve as instructions for all of God's people if they desire to serve Him as Joshua did.
- 3. By considering the actions of Joshua and the Israelites in the light of these commands, one may obtain a background for the study of the book of Judges.
- 4. Consider how a follower of God is to be strong and very courageous...
- I. Trust in God (1:5-6)
 - A. God will protect His faithful servant (Romans 8:31, 37).
 - B. God will not abandon His people (Matt. 28:20; Acts 18:9-10; Heb. 13:5).
 - C. God keeps His promises (Titus 1:2; 2 Peter 3:8-10).
- II. Obey the Word (1:7-8)
 - A. Keep <u>all</u> of the Word of God (Deuteronomy 12:32; 28:14; Rev. 22:18-19).
 - 1. Do not turn to the right hand.
 - 2. Do not turn to the left hand.
 - B. Speak the Word of God (Deut. 6:6-9; Acts 26:25; Eph. 4:15, 25, 29).
 - C. Think on the Word of God (Psalm 1:1-3; Col. 3:16; 1 Timothy 4:15-16).
- III. Have No Fear (1:9)
 - A. Trust in God removes all fear (Psalm 27:1; Matthew 10:28; Romans 8:15; 2 Timothy 1:7; Hebrews 13:6; 1 John 4:18; Revelation 2:10).
 - B. Trust in God removes all discouragement (1 Sam. 17:11; Isa. 41:10).
 - C. Trust in God removes all obstacles.
- Illustration: The Battle for Jericho (5:13 6:27)
 - A. Joshua and the Israelites trusted in God.
 - B. Joshua and the Israelites obeyed the word.
 - C. Joshua and the Israelites had no fear.

Conclusion:

- 1. The challenge at the time of Judges is: will Israel have faith without a leader.
- 2. The cycle of the Judges indicates that they did not.
- 3. Are we strong and very courageous?
