2 Samuel 3

DAVID, ABNER, AND JOAB TRUST AND TREACHERY

Introduction:

- 1. David had been anointed King over Judah.
- 2. However, Abner had worked to have Ishbosheth, Saul's son, anointed as King of Israel.
- 3. This led to conflict between Israel and Judah and between Abner (captain of Israel's army) and Joab (captain of Judah's army).
- I. The Strength of David's House

(3:1-5)

- A. As the house of Saul grew weaker, the house of David grew stronger.
- B. As evidence of this, the record of David's children born in Hebron is given.
 - 1. Chileab is also known as Daniel (1 Chron. 3:1).
 - Chileab seems to mean, "Like his father."
- C. David's polygamy will lead to conflict among his offspring.
- II. The Weakness of Israel

(3:6-11)

- A. At the beginning of this conflict, Abner was aligned strongly with Israel.
- B. However, after Ishbosheth accused him of taking Saul's concubine, he was overcome with outrage.
- C. He vowed to turn against Israel and help David become King over the entire nation of Israel.
- III. The Covenant between David and Abner

(3:12-21)

- A. Abner offered to make a covenant with David.
- B. David agreed but demanded proof of Abner's faithfulness the return of Michal, his wife.
- C. She was returned to David and Abner began persuading the tribes to align with David.
- D. Abner was having success and David celebrated with a feast.
- E. Abner left the king in peace to continue his work for David.
- IV. The Rebellion of Joab

(3:22-30)

- A. During this time, Joab and the army of Judah had been away.
- B. When Joab learned of David's covenant with Abner, he was outraged.
- C. Thus, he secretly sent word for Abner to return.
- D. Upon meeting him, Joab assassinated Abner.
- E. David declared his innocence in this matter and pronounced a curse upon Joab and his family.
- V. The Sincerity of David

(3:31-39)

- A. David proved by his actions that Joab had acted without his approval.
- B. As a result, the people approved of David.
- C. Yet, David recognized the weakness of his situation concerning Joab.
