Elders Are Watchmen

- The Need for Watchmen
- (Ezekiel 34:1-16)
- A. In Ezekiel's day, the shepherds of Israel had failed as watchmen over the nation.
 - 1. They fed themselves instead of feeding the flock.
 - 2. They failed to help the injured and ill.
 - 3. They forsook those who were lost and separated from the flock.
- B. As a result, God stated that there were no shepherds!
- C. In the end, the nation was conquered and taken captive by Babylon.
- D. The Lord's church is under constant and continual threat of attack from the Devil and his forces of evil.
 - 1. Atheism, humanism
 - 2. Denominationalism, Calvinism, Pentecostalism
 - 3. Worldliness, immorality
- E. Without shepherds who watch for the flock, congregations will be deceived, scattered, and led astray into the bondage of sin.
- II. The Character of Watchmen
- (1 Timothy 3:1-7; Titus 1:5-14)
- A. There are many qualifications that one must meet to become an elder.
- B. Several of these emphasize the role of an elder as a watchman.
 - 1. Vigilant (3:2) "Watchful, attentive, protective; not indifferent"
 - 2. Not a novice (3:6) Experienced in spiritual matters
 - 3. Lover of good men (1:8) "Fond of good; promoter of virtue"
 - 4. Exhort and convince gainsayers (1:9) Able to expose error
- C. Many others could be mentioned, but these demonstrate how important these qualifications are in selecting elders.
- III. The Focus of Watchmen

- (Acts 20:28-30)
- A. Elders are to watch themselves.
 - 1. Their own lives (1 Tim. 3; Titus 1 blameless, holy, etc.)
 - 2. Their own families (1 Tim. 3:4; Titus 1:6)
 - 3. The local eldership (Acts 20:30; cf. Matt. 15:14)
- Elders are to watch the flock.
 - 1. The lost and wayward, to bring them back (Luke 15:4-7)
 - 2. The unlearned and ignorant, to teach them (1 Cor. 3:1-3; Heb. 5:12-14)
 - 3. The gainsayers, to correct them (Titus 1:9)
 - 4. The faithful, to encourage and exhort them (Heb. 3:13)
 - 5. The flock for it was purchased with the blood of Jesus!
- C. Elders are to watch the brotherhood (Titus 1:10-11).
 - 1. Not with authority over other congregations
 - 2. But, to know what is being taught and practiced

- 3. And, to know who is teaching truth or error
- 4. Also, to set an example before them
- D. Elders are to watch the world.
 - 1. Not with authority over it
 - 2. But, to know what is happening and how it will influence and affect the church
- E. What a tremendous responsibility is carried by elders of the Lord's church.
- F. Truly, they are worthy of honor (1 Tim. 5:17) and the crown of glory (1 Peter 5:4)!
