## The Mother of Moses

## A Lesson in Love

Introduction: Exodus 1:7-22

- 1. The children of Israel grew into a mighty nation while in Egypt.
- 2. When a new Pharaoh came to power, he feared the strength of Israel.
- 3. Thus, he forced them into slavery and began to murder their newborn male children.
- 4. Into this troubled situation, Jochebed gave birth to a son Moses.
- I. She Saw **Potential** in Her Son

(Exodus 2:1-2)

- A. When her son was born, she saw that he was a goodly child.
  - 1. "Goodly" means, "Good, pleasant, agreeable, excellent, valuable."
  - 2. It may refer to physical appearance, but also goes much deeper.
- B. She viewed her son as a gift and blessing from God.
  - 1. Egypt viewed the birth of these children as a threat.
  - 2. The godly saw them as a heritage from God (Ps. 127; 1 Sam. 1:19-20).
  - 3. Relate to abortion...
- C. She saw the potential in her son as a servant of God.
  - 1. While Pharaoh was plotting wickedness, God was planning good.
  - 2. Amram and Jochebed acted by faith (Heb. 11:23).
  - 3. They trusted in the Providence of God.
  - 4. They invested in their son (cf. John 1:42).
- II. She **Protected** Her Son

(Exodus 2:2b-6)

- A. She protected him by hiding.
  - 1. For three months, until it could no longer be done
  - 2. The protection of our children is a sober responsibility.
- B. She protected him by building.
  - 1. The time came when the child could not be hidden, but must go out into the world
  - 2. Still, Jochebed protected him by building an ark of bulrushes.
  - 3. Conscience (Titus 1:15; 1 Tim. 4:2)
  - 4. Faith (Deut. 6:6-7)
  - 5. Habit (Acts 17:11)
- C. She protected him by guarding.
  - 1. Though the child was in the world, his sister watched over him.
  - 2. We must be concerned with the influences over our children (1 Cor. 15:33).
- D. She protected him by trusting.
  - 1. She did all that she could, then trusted God.
  - 2. Imagine the prayers of this godly mother.
- E. She protected him by surrendering.
  - 1. Eventually, she had to trust her son's life to another.
  - 2. There comes a time when parents must let go (cf. Matt. 19:4-6).

- III. She **Prepared** Her Son (Exodus 2:7-11)
  - A. Though Moses was raised as the son of Pharaoh's daughter, he was also reared by his mother.
  - B. She used her time wisely, educating the young child in his true heritage and in the knowledge of the true God (Heb. 11:24-27)
  - C. This is the great duty of parents to prepare their children to meet God.
