## The Reality of the Enemy

Introduction:

- 1. The Bible makes it clear that Christians are engaged in spiritual warfare (Eph. 6:10-20; 2 Tim. 2:3-4; etc.).
- 2. Because we are at war, we must understand our enemy and his tactics.
- 3. Sadly, many have doubted the existence and overlooked the reality of our enemy.
- 4. We need to be reminded about the teaching of Scripture concerning Satan.
- I. Satan Is Real!

## (Luke 22:31-32)

- A. There is both a visible and an invisible world physical and spiritual.
- B. Satan is invisible, but real.
  - 1. Satan has manifested himself in many ways (Gen. 3:1; 2 Cor. 11:14).
  - 2. Though he is unseen, he remains very active (Zech. 3:1; Mark 4:15; Luke 22:3, 31; Acts 5:3; 2 Cor. 2:11; 1 Thes. 2:18).
- C. Hell is invisible, but real.
  - 1. Jesus taught this truth (Matt. 23:33; 25:41; Mark 9:43-48; Luke 16:23).
  - 2. Hell is just as real as Heaven.
- D. Demons are invisible, but real.
  - 1. In the Old Testament, demons are often connected to idolatry (Lev. 17:7; Deut. 32:17; Psa. 106:37; cf. 1 Cor. 10:20).
  - 2. In the New Testament, demons often are manifest by harming others (Matt. 4:24; 8:16, 28; 9:32-34; 12:22; etc.).
  - 3. However, they are also connected to the teaching of false doctrine (1 Tim. 4:1; Jam. 2:19).
- E. Though the age of miracles has ended (1 Cor. 13:8-13), Satan and his evil forces still have an influence in this world.
- II. Satan Is Known!

## (Job 1:6-12)

- A. God has not left man in the dark concerning his great enemy but has revealed the nature and character of Satan.
- B. SATAN "Adversary" or "enemy" (Job 1:6)
- C. **DEVIL** "Slanderer" or "false accuser" (Matt. 4:1; cf. Job 1:9-11)
- D. **TEMPTER** "One who tries or tests another, one who entices another to sin"
- E. **THE WICKED ONE** Satan is "evil" and "bad" (Matt. 13:19, 38; 1 Jn. 2:13-14)
- F. **BEELZEBUB** "Lord of flies" or "lord of filth" (Matt. 10:25; 12:24, 27)
- G. **BELIAL** "One who is reckless, lawless, or good for nothing" (2 Cor. 6:15)
- H. THE GOD (PRINCE) OF THIS WORLD (2 Cor. 4:4; John 12:31)
  - 1. This indicates Satan's power of influence in the world of men.
  - 2. Satan is not God, nor is he a god.
  - 3. He is called 'god' because he is the object of worship for many.
  - 4. The word 'prince' means 'ruler.'
  - 5. Thus, Satan is seen as the ruler of this world when men submit to him.

- I. THE PRINCE OF THE POWER OF THE AIR (Eph. 2:2)
- J. THE SERPENT Highlights Satan's deceit, trickery, and subtlety (Rev. 12:9)
- K. THE DRAGON Illustrates Satan's destructive power (Rev. 12; 20:2)
- L. ABADDON / APPOLYON "The destroyer" (Rev. 9:11)
- M. **THE ENEMY** (Matt. 13:25-39; Luke 10:19)
- N. **MURDERER** (John 8:44; cf. Rom. 5:12; Isa. 59:1-2)
- O. **LIAR** (John 8:44)
- P. ACCUSER (Revelation 12:10)
- Q. **ONE WHO HAS POWER OVER DEATH** (Hebrews 2:14)
- R. Clearly, Satan is described as ruthless enemy of man!
  - 1. The devil is <u>real</u>.
  - 2. The devil is <u>restricted</u> in his power.
  - 3. The devil is <u>relentless</u> in his desire to destroy.
  - 4. The devil is <u>ruthless</u> in his attacks on man.
  - 5. The devil is without <u>respect</u> for God or man.
- S. Satan is still on the hunt to attack God's servants today.

Conclusion:

- 1. When the Christian studies about his enemy, he is motivated to resist him and his evil schemes.
- 2. Sadly, many are unaware of the truth about Satan and have unknowingly and unwillingly become his servants.
- 3. Others have viewed Satan as a source of power and have deliberately chosen to align themselves with him and his evil works.
- 4. The Christian must be on guard against the devil and those who are his servants.
- 5. Yet, victory is promised if we remain faithful to the Lord (James 4:7).
