## Witchcraft

## Introduction:

- 1. The Bible teaches that the enemy of man is real while also describing the tactics he uses in seeking to destroy lives and souls.
- 2. One of Satan's lies is the promise of power if one will worship him (Luke 4:5-7).
- 3. Many some of whom do not even believe in Satan believe this promise of power from a source other than God.
- 4. The word 'occult' means "hidden or secret" and refers to that which is not revealed.
- 5. The practice of occult arts is an attempt to achieve power (in one form or another) from this hidden source.
- 6. Whether it is believed or not, all occult practices and powers are linked to Satan.
  - a. God has revealed Himself and His Word.
  - b. Anything not from God is of the Devil.
- I. What Is Witchcraft in the Bible?
  - A. The first time the word "witch" is found in the Bible, God declared: "Thou shalt not suffer a witch to life" (Exo. 22:18).
  - B. The Hebrew word means, "To whisper a spell; to incant or enchant; to practice magic, sorcery, or witchcraft."
  - C. This word appears earlier in Exodus 7:11 where it is translated as "sorcerers."
  - D. The Hebrew word for "witchcraft" refers to "divination" (1 Sam. 15:23; cf. Deut. 18:10).
  - E. The New Testament word for "witchcraft" is pharmakeia (ψαρμακεια) and refers to the use of drugs or poisons (Gal. 5:20).
    - 1. Some would use such things to alter a person's perceptions, claiming mystical powers.
    - 2. This word is translated as "sorceries" is Revelation 9:21 and 18:23.
  - F. The word translated "bewitched" in Galatians 3:1 means, "To speak evil of one; to fascinate (by false representations); thus, to charm or bewitch."
  - G. Simon the Sorcerer gives a clear representation of witchcraft in Bible times (Acts 8:9-25).
    - 1. Twice it is stated that he "bewitched" people (vs. 9, 11).
    - 2. This Greek word means, "To astound, astonish, amaze; to throw into wonderment; to be out of one's mind or beside one's self."
    - 3. To do this, he practiced sorcery or magic mageuo ( $\mu\alpha\gamma\epsilon\nu\omega$ ).
    - 4. This word comes from magos ( $\mu\alpha\gamma\circ\varsigma$ ), referring to a mage or magi Oriental wise men who practiced a mixture of science and sorcery.
      - a. This word came from Babylon into Hebrew and then to Greek.
      - b. It is the word for the Wise Men who followed the star to find the young child Jesus (Matt. 2).
      - c. It came to be used for false prophets and sorcerers.

- 5. Using deceptive magic, Simon had convinced the people of Samaria that he was "the great power of God."
- 6. However, both Simon and the people were astounded when they witnessed true miracles performed by Philip the evangelist.
- 7. Though sorcerers claimed great power, in reality they only possessed the power of deception.
- H. Thus, in the Bible, witchcraft referred to the practice of divination, enchantment, and magic for malevolent purposes.

## II. What Is Modern Witchcraft?

- A. In modern times, when witchcraft is mentioned, it is usually with sympathy toward witches as an oppressed and misunderstood group.
- B. Society is given a watered down, utopian view of witchcraft in fiction stories, television shows, movies, and even news reports and documentaries.
- C. From its earliest practice, witchcraft has been a form of nature worship, seeking to control nature for health, weather, and agriculture.
- D. Modern Wicca claims to be this kind of practice and discounts black magic, evil forces, and the term 'witchcraft.'
- E. Over time, these practices came to be associated with evil spirits of the dead, demons, and Satan.
  - 1. At its roots, witchcraft is Satanic, because it comes from the Devil.
  - 2. Modern Satanism is different from witchcraft, but they share a common source.
- F. Modern witchcraft is a religion that worships gods (plural, male and female) in a form of pantheism.
  - 1. Thus, they deny that Jesus is the Son of God (cf. John 3:16).
  - 2. Their highest deity is the goddess of fertility, birth, and rebirth.
  - 3. Her counterpart is the god of death and the afterlife.
- G. A belief in reincarnation is based on the cycle of the seasons.
- H. They believe that humans possess mystical powers that can be used for good or harm.
  - 1. Retribution will be visited upon one three-fold.
  - 2. This will take place in this life.

## III. The Bible Response to Witchcraft

- A. Idolatry is condemned (Exo. 20:3; Mat. 4:10; John 17:3).
- B. Witchcraft is condemned (Exo. 22:18; Lev. 19:26, 31; 20:6, 27; Deut. 18:10-13; 2 Kin. 9:22; 21:6; 23:24; Isa. 47:9; Mic. 5:12-13).
- C. Jesus is the only Savior of man (Acts 4:12; John 14:6; 1 Thes. 5:9-10).
- D. Reincarnation is a false doctrine (Heb. 9:27; Jam. 4:14; Eph. 5:16).
- E. Witchcraft denies the Day of Judgment and eternal rewards or punishment (Acts 17:30-31).
- F. Witchcraft is rooted in evil error and is a lie of Satan!
