"For His Name's Sake" Humility in Grace

Introduction:

- 1. This may be the most important phrase in the psalm.
- 2. God love us; therefore, He saves us, guides us, and gives us a home in Heaven.
- 3. However, it is all for His glory and the honor of His name.
- 4. The sheep must never forget the dignity of the Shepherd or the nobility of His name.

I. The Peril of the Proud

- A. The sheep does not take credit for his safe arrival at green pastures.
- B. Likewise, we do not boast pridefully of our deliverance from sin or abundance of blessings (cf. Luke 17:7-10; Rom. 3:27; 4:2; 1 Cor. 9:16).
- C. God hates pride (Prov. 6:16-17; 8:13; 16:5).
- D. God opposes the proud (Jam. 4:6; 1 Pet. 5:5; Prov. 15:25).
- E. Pride leads to destruction (Prov. 16:18).
- F. Thus, we can understand Jesus' attitude toward the Pharisees (cf. Luke 18:9-14; 11:42ff; Rev. 3:17-18).

II. The Hope of the Humble

- A. God loves and cares for the humble (Psa. 9:12; Isa. 57:15; Matt. 18:4; Jam. 4:10; 1 Pet. 5:5-6).
- B. Humility demands honest assessment of oneself (Rom. 12:3).
- C. Humility brings salvation and exaltation.

III. The Nobility of the Name

- A. Endure persecution for Jesus' sake (Matt. 5:10-12; 10:18, 22, 39; 24:9).
- B. Pray and preach for Jesus' sake (Rom. 15:30).
- C. Serve for Jesus' sake (2 Cor. 4:5; Rev. 2:3).
- D. Forgiveness is for Jesus' sake (Eph. 4:32; 1 John 2:12).
