## "Surely Goodness and Mercy Shall Follow Me All the Days of My Life" Promise in Pursuit

## Introduction:

- 1. The psalm has described clearly the character and care of the Shepherd.
- 2. Having such a Good Shepherd means that blessings are assured.
- I. The Promise of God "Surely"
  - A. It is a statement of absolute, indisputable fact (2 Tim. 2:13; Jam. 1:17).
  - B. The word 'surely' can also be translated as "only."
  - C. This is in contrast with the wicked (cf. Psa. 35:5-6; 140:11; Prov. 13:21).
- II. The Pursuit of God "Goodness and Mercy Shall Follow Me"
  - A. "Goodness" refers to things that are moral, beneficial, pleasant, right, or excellent.
  - B. "Mercy" refers to loving kindness joined with faithfulness.
  - C. "Follow" means to run after, chase, or pursue.
  - D. This means that God follows after His sheep with blessings!
    - 1. Gen. 3:8-9; Exo. 3:1-6; Jonah 1:4; Luke 15:4-7; John 21:7
    - 2. Psa. 119:176; Isa. 53:6; John 10:15-16, 27-28
  - E. "Goodness supplies our needs, and mercy blots out our sins" (Spurgeon).
    - 1. "Goodness to provide. Mercy to pardon" (F. B. Meyer).
    - 2. The Shepherd's two sheepdogs do not instill fear but comfort and hope.
- III. The Product of God "Shall Follow Me"
  - A. The blessings of God should not only pursue us but also follow in our wake.
  - B. What influence do I leave behind (Acts 4:36)?
  - C. What legacy will I leave behind (Heb. 11:4; Rev. 14:13)?
- IV. The Persistence of God "All the Days of My Life"
  - A. God will never give up on us...
  - B. Unless we give up on Him.
