THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT LESSON 09 - LOVE

Text: Galatians 5:22-23

Introduction:

- The great battle of our lives here upon Earth is between the flesh and the Spirit.
- 2. Ultimately, this is a conflict over who will reign and rule in our lives man (the flesh) or God (the Spirit).
- When we choose to walk after the Spirit, we will bear His fruit in our lives.
- 4. "The fruit of the Spirit is love."

1. The Meaning of Love

- A. The Greek words for love...
 - 1. Eros "the love between a husband and wife"
 - 2. Storge "the love between parents and children; patriotism or devotion to another (cause, pet, etc.)"
 - 3. Phileo "to be a friend; to be fond of; to have affection for" (John 15:19; 12:25)
 - 4. Agape "brotherly love, affection; good will; to love in a social or moral sense" (John 15:13; 1 Corinthians 13)
- B. What love is not...
 - Love is not merely a spoken word [or words] (1 John 3:18).
 - a. There is nothing wrong with speaking words of love.
 - b. In fact, we should do more of that.
 - c. But, words alone do not constitute true love.
 - 2. Love is not merely an emotion (1 Corinthians 13:4-7).
 - Clearly, emotions are involved in love (1 Peter 3:8; Romans 12:10).
 - b. But, emotions alone do not constitute true love.
 - 3. Love is not lust (Hebrews 13:4).
 - a. Many equate love with lust or sex.
 - b. However, true love will not violate God's Word.
 - 4. Love is not license to sin (John 14:15, 21).
 - a. Many think that love eliminates law.
 - b. But, true love corrects (Proverbs 13:24; Hebrews 12:6).
- C. What love is...
 - 1. Love is seeking what is best for another.
 - 2. Love arises from a benevolent and compassionate attitude of the giver, not from the worthiness of the recipient.
 - 3. True love is an act of the will under the control of man (1 Cor. 13).
- 11. The Fruit of the Spirit Is Love
 - A. Joy is love's consciousness!
 - B. Peace is love's confidence!
 - C. Longsuffering is love's habit!
 - D. Goodness is love's quality!
 - E. Faith is love's manifestation!
 - F. Meekness is love's strength!
 - G. Temperance is love's victory!

III. The Law of Love

- A. "For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself" (Galatians 5:14).
- B. James calls this the "Royal Law" "If ye fulfill the royal law according to the scripture, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself, ye do well" (James 2:8).
- C. Not only is this the greatest commandment of God (Mark 12:28-31), but "against such there is no law!"
- D. "All those who do these works of God, find no law of God interfering with them in the exercise of their labors" (J. W. McGarvey).
- E. One who lives according to God's Word and produces the fruit of the Spirit has no law that can be brought against him (cf. John 8:46; 14:30).
- F. This man is "free indeed!" (John 8:36; cf. Gen. 4:7)
