Genesis 12:1-3

Blessedness for All through Abraham

Text: Genesis 12:1-3

Introduction:

- 1. God had promised that the seed of woman would crush the head of the serpent and the enemy of man would be defeated (Genesis 3:15).
- 2. For the next 2,000 years that promise remained unfulfilled.
- 3. The world grew increasingly wicked and was destroyed by God with the Flood.
- 4. As man began to repopulate the Earth, God returned to His promise with the call of Abraham.
- I. THE CALL OF ABRAHAM
 - A. While living in Ur of the Chaldees, Abram was called by God to leave that land (Acts 7:2-4).
 - B. Abraham was to be separated from:
 - 1. His country the land of Ur
 - 2. His kindred extended family or tribe
 - 3. His father's house immediate family (cf. Luke 14:26-33; 2 Corinthians 6:17)
 - C. Abraham was to follow God by faith trust joined with obedience (cf. Hebrews 11:8).
 - D. Thus, his life became an illustration of true faith (cf. Romans 4).
- II. The Promise of God
 - A. Land Promise God promised the land of Canaan as a home for Abraham's descendants (cf. Genesis 15:7, 18).
 - 1. This promise was fulfilled (Joshua 21:43-45; Psalm 44:3; 1 Kings 4:21).
 - 2. This promise was conditional (Deuteronomy 28:63-64).
 - B. Nation Promise God promised to make a great nation of Abraham's descendants (cf. Genesis 13:16; 18:18).
 - 1. This promise was fulfilled in Egypt (Genesis 46:3; Exodus 1:7).
 - 2. This promise was fulfilled at Sinai (Exodus 20; Deuteronomy 4:5-8).
 - C. Blessing Promise God promised to bless all mankind through Abraham's seed (cf. Genesis 22:18; 26:4).
- III. THE PROPHECY OF JESUS
 - A. The promise of blessing was made through Abraham's seed.
 - B. This was a reference to one individual, the same seed that would crush the head of the serpent (cf. Genesis 3:15).
 - C. This was a prophecy about Jesus (Acts 3:25-26; Galatians 3:16)!
 - 1. Jesus allows all to become the descendants of Abraham (Galatians 3:26-29).
 - 2. Thus, anyone may become one of God's blessed through the blood of Jesus!
