Before and After Repentance

Text: 2 Corinthians 7:8-10

Introduction:

- 1. Repentance is a change of heart (mind) brought about by godly sorrow and resulting in a reformation of lifestyle.
- 2. One must understand what comes both before and after repentance.
- I. Things That Precede Repentance
 - A. Hearing the Gospel (Matt. 3:1-2; 4:17; 12:41; Luke 16:30-31) thus, an awareness of sin (Matt. 9:13; 2 Cor. 12:21)
 - B. Believing the Gospel (2 Tim. 2:24-26)
 - 1. Faith in Jesus precedes repentance (Luke 24:46-47).
 - 2. Mark 1:15 was not spoken to alien sinners, but to those already in covenant with God (cf. Ac. 19:4; 20:21).
 - C. Godly Sorrow (2 Corinthians 7:8-10)
 - 1. The "sorrow of the world" comes from a fleshly view of sin (cf. Matthew 27:3).
 - 2. Godly sorrow comes from viewing sin from God's perspective the cross (cf. Rom. 2:4; Matt. 11:20-21).
 - D. Without these, true repentance cannot take place.
- II. Things That Follow Repentance
 - A. Conversion (Acts 3:19)
 - B. Submission and obedience (Acts 2:38)
 - C. A change of behavior (Matt. 21:28-29)
 - D. Fruit of repentance (Matt. 3:8; Luke 3:8)
 - E. Restitution (Acts 26:20; Luke 15:17-20; 19:8)
 - F. For the Christian, prayer (Acts 8:22)
- III. Things That Accompany Repentance
 - A. Salvation (Luke 13:3, 5; 17:3-4)
 - B. Joy in Heaven (Luke 15:7, 10)
 - C. Deliverance (Rev. 2:5, 16; 3:19)
