Numbers 24:17

A Star out of Jacob

Text: Numbers 24:15-25

Introduction:

- 1. God had promised that the seed of woman would crush the head of the serpent and the enemy of man would be defeated (Genesis 3:15).
- 2. He showed that this victory would include blessedness for all through the seed of Abraham (Genesis 12:1-3).
- 3. This Victor would also be kinsman of man who could serve as a daysman or mediator (Job 19:23-27).
- 4. He would also be a King over a righteous and eternal spiritual kingdom (Genesis 49:10).
- 5. As the Israelites journeyed to the Promised Land of Canaan, Balaam prophesied of both a Star and a Scepter...
- I. THE BACKGROUND OF BALAAM
 - A. Balaam was a not a true prophet of God, but one who practiced occult arts.
 - B. He had learned about Jehovah because of God's destruction of Egypt.
 - C. He was a sorcerer, deceiving people by occult practices.
 - 1. Numbers 22:7 "rewards of divination"
 - 2. Numbers 23:23 "enchantment" and "divination"
 - 3. Numbers 24:1 "enchantments"
 - 4. Joshua 13:22 "soothsayer"
 - D. He is never called a prophet of God (2 Peter 2:15-16 context is referring to false prophets).
 - E. He was an enemy of God and Israel (Num. 31:8, 16; cf. 2 Pet. 2:15; Jude 11; Rev. 2:14).
- II. THE PROPHECY OF BALAAM
 - A. In spite of this background, God chose to speak through Balaam.
 - B. Balak had hired him to curse the nation of Israel (Numbers 22:1-6).
 - C. Though he sought to do this, God would speak through him words of blessing.
 - 1. God could speak through a dumb, stubborn donkey (Num. 22:28).
 - 2. And God could speak through a rebellious, stubborn man like Balaam.
 - D. Thus, Balaam delivered four prophecies about Israel (Numbers 23 24).
 - E. Balaam's fourth prophecy looked forward to the days of the Messiah (Num. 24:15-25).
 - 1. The things he saw would come to pass, but not immediately.
 - 2. There would come a Star out of Jacob and a Scepter out of Israel.
 - 3. God would be victorious over all enemies through this Savior.
- III. THE FULFILLMENT IN JESUS
 - A. The Star out of Jacob was Jesus.
 - 1. When Jesus was born, a star led the Wise Men to Him (Matthew 2:1-9).
 - 2. Zacharias called Jesus "the dayspring from on high" referring to a rising of the stars or the sun (Luke 1:78-79).
 - 3. Peter used the term "day star" referencing the morning star (Venus) heralding the coming of dawn (2 Peter 1:19).

- 4. Jesus identifies Himself as the "bright and morning star" (Revelation 22:16; cf. 2:28).
- B. The Scepter out of Israel was also Jesus.
 - 1. This was prophesied by Jacob (Genesis 49:10).
 - 2. It was also foretold by the Psalmist and fulfilled in Jesus (Psalm 45:6; Hebrews 1:8).
 - 3. The word for 'scepter' can also refer to a "staff, rod, or branch" (cf. Psalm 110:1-2).
- C. He would defeat and possess all nations by the preaching of the Gospel in all the world (Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16; etc.).
- D. He would also have dominion as a King (Psalm 2; Isa. 11:10; Micah 5:2-4; Heb. 1:8; 1 Pet. 3:22; Rev. 19:16; etc.).
- E. "Who shall live when God does this!" (Cf. Malachi 3:2)
- F. God had a plan that had been put into motion and He would accomplish His purpose by bringing the Messiah into the world.
