1 Samuel 2:35

A Faithful Priest

Text: 1 Samuel 2:27-36

Introduction:

- 1. God had promised that the seed of woman would crush the head of the serpent and the enemy of man would be defeated (Genesis 3:15).
- 2. He showed that this victory would include blessedness for all through the seed of Abraham (Genesis 12:1-3).
- 3. This Victor would also be kinsman of man who could serve as a daysman or mediator (Job 19:23-27).
- 4. He would also be a King over a righteous and eternal spiritual kingdom (Genesis 49:10)

 a scepter out of Israel and a star out of Jacob (Numbers 24:17).
- 5. He would be the prophet whose word must be heard and obeyed (Deut. 18:15-19).
- 6. Yet, in the time of Samuel it was learned that He would also be a faithful priest...

I. THE REJECTION OF THE CORRUPT PRIESTHOOD

- A. Eli's sons were vile, wicked men who abused their positions as priests (2:12-17, 22-25).
- B. Therefore, they would be killed (2:25) and the priesthood of Eli and his descendants would be rejected.
- C. The man of God reminded Eli of the priesthood's past (vs. 27-28).
- D. The man of God dealt with the priesthood's present (vs. 29).
- E. The man of God looked to the priesthood's future (vs. 30-36).
 - 1. God would no longer honor Eli or his sons.
 - 2. God would cut off the strength of Eli's bloodline.
 - 3. God would not allow any of Eli's descendants to live to an old age (cf. 4:11; 14:3; 22:18ff; 1 Kings 2:27).
 - 4. God would cause those of Eli's house to beg for food.
 - 5. God would give a sign to confirm His word: Eli's two sons would die on the same day.
- F. Thus, God rejected the priesthood of Eli.

II. THE REPLACEMENT OF THE CORRUPT PRIESTHOOD

- A. It is important to notice that God's promise concerning the priesthood seemed to be absolute but was conditional (cf. Exo. 29:9; 40:15; Num. 25:10-13).
- B. God promised to raise up a faithful priest who would follow His will (2:35).
 - 1. This seems to be a reference to Zadok rather than Samuel (1 Kings 2:26-27).
 - 2. Samuel did not have a "sure house" because his children were unfaithful.
 - 3. However, Samuel was a faithful priest in contrast to Eli's wicked sons (7:9-10).
- C. In contrast to the corrupt sons of Eli, Samuel was a faithful child of God (2:18-21, 26).
- D. He would lead the people through a time of great turmoil and confusion.

III. THE PROMISE FULFILLED IN JESUS

A. Though this promise had to do with the Old Testament priesthood, there was also a look forward to the time of Jesus.

- B. Jesus would be the true High Priest of God (Hebrews 2:17).
- C. He would have a "sure house" a priesthood that will endure until the end of time.
 - 1. Jesus was from the tribe of Judah, not Levi; thus, a change of the law had to take place (Hebrews 7:12-14).
 - 2. He would be a priest after the order of Melchisedec (Hebrews 5:1-10; 7:15-22).
 - 3. Thus, He would be a priest forever (Hebrews 7:23-25).
- D. Jesus is the true High Priest of God Who serves in Heaven on behalf of His disciples!

Conclusion: Jesus is the only way to salvation.
