## Benefits of Seeking Wisdom

Text: Proverbs 2

Introduction: What Is Wisdom?

- 1. Six Hebrew words are translated as "wisdom."
- 2. Considered together they reveal two basic principles.
- 3. The most common word for 'wisdom' means, "A pattern of thinking; technical skill" (cf. Exodus 31:1-11).
- **John 8:44** Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it.
- A second definition means, "A choice that distinguishes between good and bad; the power of judgment that results from understanding; prudent decisionmaking."
- 5. Thus, wisdom requires three things:
  - a. A proper knowledge of God
  - b. A proper respect for parents
  - c. A proper understanding of the world

## Background: Job 28

- 1. Job asked, "Where shall wisdom be found?" (28:12).
- 2. It is not to be found in the imagination or inventiveness of men (28:1-12).
- 3. It is not to be found for purchase by money (28:13-19).
- 4. It is not to be found by man's sight (28:20-21).
- 5. It is not to be found in death or among the dead (28:22).
- 6. It is only understood and revealed by God, for it is His nature (28:23-27).
- 7. Wisdom is found in the "fear of the Lord" (28:28).
  - a. This is a holy fear respectful, reverential, and submissive.
  - b. It is produced by and responded to with love (1 John 4:16-19).
- 8. This is the theme of Proverbs (and the example of the life of Solomon).
- I. Protection by Walking with God (Proverbs 2:1-9)
  - A. "The question is not whether any would like knowledge or wisdom, but 'How much do we want it?'" Franklin Camp
    - The benefits of wisdom are astounding!
    - 2. But the price to be paid is steep.
  - B. The Price of Wisdom (vs. 1-5) Note the word "**IF**"
    - 1. Reception receive my words
    - 2. Retention hide my commandments

- 3. Rising *incline thine ear*
- 4. Relevance *apply thine heart*
- 5. Request *cry after; lift up thy voice*
- 6. Research seek; search
- 7. Rejoice understand; find
- C. The Benefits of Wisdom (vs. 6-9)
  - 1. Hearing the Word of God *communication and communion*
  - 2. Access to Truth
  - 3. Protection buckler = a shield; guard; hedge about (Isa. 35)
  - 4. Understanding
- D. Wisdom allows one to walk with God Who protects both the traveler and his path.
- II. Prevention from Walking with the Wicked (Proverbs 2:10-19)
  - A. Wisdom produces discretion the understanding and ability to plan to avoid evil and sin (cf. Matt. 10:16; 1 Cor. 14:20; Eph. 5:15; 6:11; 2 Cor. 2:11).
  - B. Wisdom produces deliverance the ability to tear oneself away from the plans and paths of wicked men.
  - C. Wisdom produces direction to be quickly removed from the flattery and corruption of profane women (cf. chapter 7).
  - D. This passage is summarized in Psalm 1.
- III. Preservation in Walking with the Righteous (Proverbs 2:20-22)
  - A. Wisdom grants fellowship with those who are good.
  - B. Wisdom allows travel on paths that are righteous.
  - C. Wisdom enables one to be upright and perfect (complete or entire).
  - D. Wisdom provides a habitation where one both lives and thrives.
  - E. In contrast, the wicked will be violently cut off and torn away from security and salvation.

Conclusion: Which path in life will you choose? Are you in need of wisdom? (Matthew 7:13-14; James 1:5)
