Isaiah 61

"To Preach Good Tidings"

Text: Isaiah 61

Introduction:

- 1. God had promised that the seed of woman would crush the head of the serpent and the enemy of man would be defeated (Genesis 3:15).
- 2. He showed that this victory would include blessedness for all through the seed of Abraham (Genesis 12:1-3).
- 3. This Victor would be a mediator (Job 19:23-27), a ruler (Genesis 49:10), a star (Numbers 24:17), a prophet (Deuteronomy 18:15-19), a priest (1 Samuel 2:35), and a king (1 Samuel 2:10) ruling from the throne of David (1 Chronicles 17:11-14).
- 4. During the time of David, the "sweet psalmist of Israel" (2 Samuel 23:1) recorded many prophecies of Jesus in the Psalms.
- 5. In the writings of the prophets, much more detail about the coming Messiah was given.
- 6. Isaiah declared that the Messiah would become man's propitiation the suitable sacrifice for sin...

I. THE BACKGROUND

- A. The name Isaiah means, "Jehovah is salvation," "salvation is of Jehovah," or "Jehovah saves."
- B. Chapters 1 39 of Isaiah detail <u>judgment from God</u> on the nations of the world, including Israel and Judah.
- C. Chapters 40 66 record <u>comfort from God</u> in promises of Israel's return and the coming of the Messiah.
- D. Chapters 60 62 discuss the glory of Zion.
 - 1. This pertained to the return from captivity and the rebuilding of Jerusalem.
 - 2. However, the ultimate fulfillment of these chapters is the establishing of the church by the Messiah.
- E. A breakdown of this section:
 - 1. 60:1-3 - Glory in the Light of God 2. 60:4-9 - Glory in the Salvation of God 3. 60:10-14 - Glory in the Mercy of God 4. 60:15-18 - Glory in the Blessings of God 5. 60:19-22 - Glory in the Presence of God 6. 61:1-3 - Glory in the Preaching of the Gospel 7. 61:4-9 - Glory in the Service of a Christian 8. 61:10-11 - Glory in the Praise of Jehovah 9. 62:1-5 - Glory in the New Name 10. 62:6-9 - Glory in the Protection of God 11. 62:10-12 - Glory in the Redemption from Sin
- II. Prophecy of the Preaching of Jesus (Isaiah 61:1-3)
 - A. The speaker is the Servant Jesus the Christ (cf. Luke 4:16-22).
 - B. Spiritual Zion is glorious because God would anoint Jesus through the Holy Spirit to establish this kingdom by the preaching of the Gospel (cf. Acts 10:38)!

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Prophecy of Jesus

- 1. Isaiah has revealed much about the unity of work with Jesus and the Holy Spirit (11:2-3; 42:1; 48:16; 49:8; 50:4; 59:21).
- 2. There is always perfect unity with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- C. Jesus would preach good news to the meek.
 - 1. The Gospel is good news of salvation from sin.
 - 2. However, it would be accepted only by the meek and humble (cf. Matthew 5:3-5; 11:5, 29; 21:5).
- D. Jesus would bind up and heal the brokenhearted.
 - 1. The word for "bind up" means to wrap or to bandage.
 - 2. Jesus offers healing to those whose hearts have been crushed by sin (cf. 57:15; Psalm 34:18; 51:17; 147:3; 2 Corinthians 7:6).
- E. Jesus would proclaim liberty to the captive.
 - 1. Liberty "is a technical term for the release of debtors and slaves in the fiftieth year, the year of jubilee (Lev. 25:10; Jer. 34:8, 15)" [Hailey].
 - 2. Those held captive by Satan and sin are offered freedom (cf. 42:7; John 8:32-36; Acts 26:18; Romans 6:16-18; 2 Timothy 2:25-26).
- F. Jesus would proclaim the acceptable year of Jehovah.
 - 1. The ASV renders this as "the year of Jehovah's favor."
 - 2. The acceptable time is the period during which God's grace is made available to man the Christian dispensation (cf. 2 Corinthians 6:2).
- G. Jesus would proclaim the day of God's vengeance.
 - 1. The day of vengeance is when God's grace is no longer accessible.
 - a. End of one's life
 - b. Judgment upon a nation
 - c. End of the world / Day of Judgment
 - 2. This is a day of salvation for those who are faithful and obedient.
- H. Jesus would comfort those who mourn (Matthew 5:4; Luke 7:44-50; 2 Cor. 1:3-5).
 - 1. By giving them beauty (garland, headdress) for ashes (vs. 10)
 - 2. By giving them the oil of joy instead of mourning (cf. Psalm 23:5; John 16:20)
 - 3. By giving them garments of praise instead of a heavy (weak, infirm, faint) spirit (cf. Luke 15:22; Revelation 7:9-14).
- I. Jesus would plant the righteous as trees that bear fruit of honor and glory to God (cf. Matthew 7:17-19; John 15:8).
- J. This Gospel that Jesus preached is the same that we must proclaim!

Conclusion: We have <u>Good News</u> that must be shared with the world!

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
