Prayer Is Partial

Text: Philippians 4:6-7

INTRODUCTION:

- As important as prayer is, it is only part of living a faithful Christian life. 1.
- 2. When we pray, we expect God to respond.
- In like manner, when He speaks, God expects us to respond. 3.
- Communication involves the speaking and response of both parties. 4.
- How should we respond to God... 5.

I. THE RESPONSE OF GRATITUDE

- (PHILIPPIANS 4:6-7) Praver should be offered with an attitude of thankfulness - even in difficulties. A.
- Gratitude is central to the life of a Christian (Colossians 3:15-17). Β.
- Prayer should be responded to with gratitude (2 Corinthians 1:8-11). C.
- II. THE RESPONSE OF **READING**
 - Man communicates with God through prayer; God communicates with man A. through Scripture.
 - Often, the answer to one's prayer is ready to be found in the Word of God. B.
 - If one does not read the Bible, he cannot hear the answer to his prayers! {Had C. Cornelius not listened to Peter, he would not have heard God answer to his prayers.}

III. THE RESPONSE OF **OBEDIENCE**

- Heartbroken over his sins, David prayed to God for forgiveness and cleansing. A.
- However, he also understood that his praying to God (and God's answering) B. demanded a response.
- C. Thus. David promised to obey God by teaching others and offering true sacrifice.
- D. Can one expect God to answer his prayers if he refuses to obey God's will?

IV. THE RESPONSE OF WORSHIP

- Again, David called upon the Lord in a time of great need (vs. 1-8). A.
- B. As before, David understood that a response was required - obedience and worship (vs. 9-13).
- C. David honored God with his praver and vowed to glorify God in response.
- Praver without praise is perhaps the lowest form of ingratitude (Luke 17:12-19). D.

- Do I recognize the importance of prayer and pray regularly? 1.
- Do I also understand that prayer demands a response on my part? 2.
- How do I respond to the wonderful blessing of prayer? 3.
- What changes can I make to show God how thankful I am that He hears my prayers? 4.

Prayer Is Personal

- 1. Read Matthew 6:5-6. Prayer is not a performance to be seen of men. What is the value of private prayer in secret?
- 2. Read Matthew 6:7-8. Prayer is not rote memorization or repetition just for increasing one's word count. How can I make my prayers more personal?
- 3. Read Matthew 6:9-13. Prayer is to be reverential but also humble, even simple. Do I find myself trying to impress God or others with my prayers? How does the "model prayer" help me to remain humble before God?
- 4. Read Hebrews 4:12-13. How can understanding that God knows everything about me even my thoughts and motives affect my prayers?
- 5. Read Proverbs 28:13. Have you ever tried to hide something from God? Do we sometimes pray when there is sin we refuse to acknowledge? Will God hear such a prayer?
- 6. Read 1 John 1:7-10. As a Christian, prayer is one's personal access to the Father for the forgiveness of sins. Strive to come before God openly and honestly in every prayer!
