Practical Prayer

Prayer Is Personal

Text: Matthew 6:5-13

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Prayer is crucial and must be central in the life of a Christian.
- 2. It is much more than mere ritual or an act to be performed perfunctorily.
- 3. Prayer is profoundly personal.
- 4. It is man expressing the deepest desires and extreme emotions of his heart to the loving ear of Almighty God.
- I. PRAYER IS NOT A PERFORMANCE FOR MEN (MATTHEW 6:5-6)
 - A. Notice that prayer is an expected action "when" not "if."
 - B. Because prayer is a sign of a faithful spiritual life, many have used it to pretend to be someone they are not.
 - 1. As hypocrites, they merely play the part.
 - 2. Their goal is to be seen of men, and they have their reward.
 - C. Instead, prayer is to be a pouring out of one's heart, desires, and vows to God as a freewill offering.
 - D. Thus, prayer is to be private and personal with secrecy and sincerity.
 - E. Jesus does not condemn public prayer certainly not in the assembly but does demand that one's prayer must come from the heart.
- II. PRAYER IS NOT A PERFORMANCE FOR GOD (MATTHEW 6:7-8)
 - A. In the same way, prayer must not be viewed as a ritual means to get the attention of God (cf. 1 Kings 18:26-29; Acts 19:34).
 - B. Vain repetitions are mechanical memorizations stated again and again without thought as to what one is saying insincere utterances.
 - 1. Repetition is not condemned (cf. Matthew 26:39, 42, 44; Daniel 9:18-19).
 - 2. Even memorization is allowed so long as it comes from the heart.
 - C. One does not have to gain God's attention to pray to Him, for He is always present, ready to hear, and already knows the needs of man!
 - D. Thus, prayer is to be personal, sincere communication with the Lord.
- III. PRAYER IS NOT A PERFORMANCE FOR SELF (MATTHEW 6:9-13)
 - A. One must not enter into prayer with God while being dishonest with himself.
 - B. God already knows us perfectly, inside and out (Hebrews 4:12-13).
 - C. One must not try to hide his sins from God (Proverbs 28:13; 1 John 1:7-10).
 - D. One must not try to deny his dependence upon God.
 - E. Prayer is to be a personal cry of reliance upon the Father in Heaven.

CONCLUSION:

- 1. Prayer is not a performance.
- 2. Instead, prayer is personal, between me and God.
- 3. How will understanding this affect my prayers?
- 4. What changes can I make to be more personal in my prayers to God?
