### Prayer Is Partnered

Text: Luke 11:1-13

#### INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Prayer is not merely an exercise for the faithful Christian.
- 2. There is a God who hears and responds to prayer!
- 3. In fact, the Bible teaches that the Godhead is involved in the prayers of the saint.
- 4. God Himself becomes man's partner in prayer...
- I. THE ROLE OF THE FATHER IN PRAYER (LUKE 11:11-13)
  - A. As a Father, God promises to hear the prayers of His children.
  - B. He will answer prayer with what is best for the one who asks.
- II. THE ROLE OF THE SON IN PRAYER (1 TIMOTHY 2:1-6)
  - A. Prayer is offered in the name of Jesus by His authority (John 16:23-28).
  - B. Jesus is the one Mediator between God and man (1 Timothy 2:5).
    - 1. A mediator is "one who acts between two parties and belongs to both; one who intervenes between two, in order to make or restore peace."
    - 2. In this way, Jesus serves as High Priest (Hebrews 2:16-18; 4:14-16; 5:6-9).
  - C. Jesus is an Intercessor between God and man.
    - 1. An intercessor is "one who entreats or consults with one on behalf of another."
    - 2. In this way, Jesus serves as Advocate (Hebrews 7:25; 1 John 2:1; Romans 8:34).
- III. THE ROLE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN PRAYER (ROMANS 8:15-28)
  - A. The Holy Spirit is a person a member of the Godhead.
  - B. Every non-miraculous work attributed to the Holy Spirit is also said to be done by the Scripture, save one prayer.
  - C. The Holy Spirit is an Intercessor in man's prayers (Romans 8:15-28).
    - 1. Vs. 15-17 We are children of God.
    - 2. Vs. 18-23 Yet we live in a world of suffering.
    - 3. Vs. 24-25 *We are saved by hope.*
    - 4. Vs. 26-27 The Holy Spirit helps in our prayers.
      - a. He bears our burdens before God's throne.
      - b. God knows the "mind of the Spirit."
      - c. Thus, our prayers are heard and our struggles are known.

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- 5. Vs. 28 All things word together for good.
- D. The Christian has two Intercessors with the Father ensuring our prayers are heard and in harmony with His will (cf. Revelation 5:8; 8:3-5).

#### CONCLUSION: Psalm 37:4-5

- 1. Does the fact that God is involved intimately in my prayers affect my motivation to pray or the way that I pray?
- 2. The love and care that God has for us is amazing to contemplate and difficult to comprehend.
