Beatitudes What The Bible Teaches About Being Blessed

BLESSED IS THE MAN WHO CONSIDERS THE POOR

Text: Psalm 41:1

Introduction:

- 1. "Where the word *blessed* is hung out as a sign, we may be sure that we shall find a godly man within." *Sir Richard Baker*
- 2. Biblically, the word "blessed" refers to those whose sufficiency comes from God and not from the circumstances of life.
- 3. The "blessed" are those who inherit the promise made to Abraham by conforming to God's Will and being added to the body of Christ.
- 4. How does one properly consider the poor?
- I. Serving the Sick (Psalm 41:1)
 - B. The word "poor" means: "low, poor, weak, thin, one who is low."
 - 1. Generally, this word can refer to those who are downtrodden, poor, or the less fortunate in society.
 - 2. In the context of this psalm, the reference is to those who are low or weak in physical health the sick.
 - C. The word "consider" means: "to look at, to behold; then, to be prudent or circumspect; then, to attend to; and then in general to act prudently, wisely, intelligently."
 - D. Thus, to consider the poor is to look at the situation closely and use wisdom to properly attend to their needs. {Another idea of this passage is likely that one should endeavor to 'consider' (or seek out) the poor.}
 - E. How do we serve the sick?
 - 1. Pray for them (James 5:13-14; 2 Chronicles 16:12).
 - 2. Encourage them.
 - 3. Visit them (Matthew 25:36, 43).
 - E. To be one of God's blessed, we must serve the sick.
- II. Nurturing the Needy (Psalm 106:3)
 - A. The word "judgment" means: "justice, equity."
 - B. Those who are just and honest in life will remember the poor.
 - 1. Proverbs 14:21: 19:17: Job 29:12-16: 31:13-22
 - 2. Deuteronomy 15:7-11; Isaiah 58:7-11
 - 3. 2 Corinthians 9:6-14; Galatians 6:9-10
 - C. Those who are unjust will mistreat others who are less fortunate than they.
 - 1. Ezekiel 34:1-6; 1 Kings 21:1-19 (Naboth's vineyard)
 - 2. James 2:1-9
 - D. Those who are just will care for others with no thought of reward (Luke 14:10-14; Galatians 2:10; Matthew 25:31-46; Acts 20:35; Ephesians 4:28).

III. Saving the Sinner (Isaiah 56:1-8)

- A. Those who consider the poor and keep judgment are fit citizens for the kingdom of Christ.
- B. Furthermore, they realize that the salvation offered by God through Christ is available to all men strong or weak, rich or poor.
- C. They also understand that man's spiritual needs are greater than his physical needs.
- D. Thus, the blessed individual will go into the highways and byways to seek and save the lost and offer them the joy of the blessed life!

Conclusion:

- 1. One who is blessed of God will consider the poor by serving the sick and nurturing the needy.
- 2. His attitude is one of compassion and concern for his fellow man.
- 3. Thus, he seeks what is best for his neighbor whether friend or enemy.
