Beatitudes What The Bible Teaches About Being Blessed

BLESSED IS THE MAN WHO OBEYS

Text: Psalm 112:1

Introduction:

- 1. "Where the word *blessed* is hung out as a sign, we may be sure that we shall find a godly man within." *Sir Richard Baker*
- 2. Biblically, the word "blessed" refers to those whose sufficiency comes from God and not from the circumstances of life.
- 3. The "blessed" are those who inherit the promise made to Abraham by conforming to God's Will and being added to the body of Christ.
- 4. This lesson focuses on several beatitudes that emphasize the importance of obeying the Law of God.
 - a. Obedience begins with an attitude of reverence for God.
 - b. The obedient find joy in keeping God's Word.
- 5. The theme throughout this lesson will be Revelation 1:3 "Blessed is he that readeth, and they that hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written therein: for the time is at hand."
- I. Blessed Are the Readers
 - A. The phrase "he that readeth" refers to the public reader of Scripture.
 - 1. Often in the early church, letters were written to one specific congregation.
 - 2. When the letter was received and the church was assembled, someone would read the letter aloud publicly.
 - 3. These inspired letters were then passed around to other congregations to be read and studied (Colossians 4:16; 1 Thessalonians 5:27).
 - B. It is important for God's Word to be read publicly and aloud.
 - C. It is also important for the Bible to be read privately.
 - 1. Paul says that by reading the Bible we may come to understand the will of God (Ephesians 3:2-4).
 - 2. Paul commands that Christians are to put their minds to the work of reading Scripture (1 Timothy 4:13).
 - D. Those who will be pleasing to God are individuals who spend time reading His Word.
- II. Blessed Are the Hearers
 - A. When the Word of God is read publicly, those who hear it are also blessed.
 - B. It is important to hear the Word of God.
 - 1. Hearing God's Word brings wisdom (Proverbs 8:33-34).
 - 2. Hearing God's Word brings faith (Romans 10:17).
 - 3. Hearing God's Word brings guidance (John 10:3).
 - 4. Hearing God's Word brings forgiveness (Matthew 18:16; Jn. 5:24).
 - C. Those who will be pleasing to God are individuals who hear His Word.

- III. Blessed Are the Keepers
 - A. As important as reading and hearing God's Word are, they are useless without a willingness to obey what has been read or heard.
 - B. It is important to keep the Word of God.
 - 1. Obedience requires the whole heart (Psalm 119:1-2).
 - 2. Obedience is keeping God's commands (Proverbs 8:32-34; Luke 11:28).
 - 3. Obedience is a way of life (cf. Psalm 128:1).
 - 4. Obedience makes one undefiled.
 - C. To hear and not obey the Word of God brings condemnation.
 - 1. Deception (James 1:21-25).
 - 2. Destruction (Matthew 7:21-27).
 - D. To hear and obey the Word of God brings salvation (Revelation 22:7, 14).
