Prayer Is Providential

Part 1

Text: Esther 4:14

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. There is a God who hears and responds to prayer!
- 2. However, man often wonders how God accomplishes the answer to prayer.
- 3. Must He perform a miracle? Or does He only rely upon natural law?
- 4. It is helpful to understand the connection between God's providence and the answer to payer.
- I. THE PROVIDENCE OF GOD
 - A. The word "providence" has to do with forethought and provision (Acts 24:2; Romans 13:14).
 - B. Easton defines it as, "God's preserving and governing all things by means of second causes."
 - 1. It is more than natural law.
 - 2. It is less than miraculous.
 - C. Consider three Biblical examples of God's providence:
 - 1. Joseph (Genesis 50:20)
 - 2. Esther (Esther 4:14)
 - 3. Jesus (Galatians 4:4; Ephesians 1:10)
- II. PROVIDENCE AND THE PRAYER OF ELIJAH
 - A. The prayer of Elijah affected the weather (James 5:17-18).
 - B. Yet, his prayer was not answered by a miracle (1 Kings 17:1; 18:1, 41-46).
 - C. God worked by controlling His natural laws.
- III. PROVIDENCE AND THE PRAYER OF THE CHRISTIAN
 - A. James used this event in the life of Elijah to illustrate the power of prayer.
 - B. The Christian is to pray for the afflicted (2 Timothy 2:3, 9; 4:5; Romans 15:30-32).
 - C. The Christian is to pray for the physically sick:
 - 1. Prayer of intercession
 - 2. Joined with the use of medicine (cf. 2 Kings 20:1-7)
 - 3. Results in healing (Philippians 2:25-27)
 - 4. According to God's will (cf. 2 Timothy 4:20; 2 Corinthians 12:7-9)
 - D. The Christian is to pray for the spiritually sick.
 - 1. Physical sickness should cause one to consider his spiritual health.
 - 2. Sin may be forgiven through repentance, confession, and prayer.
