Prayer Is Predicated

Text: Isaiah 59:1-2

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. There is a God who hears and responds to prayer!
- 2. However, His answer to one's prayer is often different than expected or desired.
- 3. Sometimes, God's answer to one's prayer is, "No" or "Wait."
- 4. It is helpful to understand the connection between God's providence and the answer to payer.
- I. PRAYER IS PREDICATED ON FAITHFULNESS
 - A. In order to enjoy the privilege of prayer, one must be a Christian.
 - B. Yet, there are things that will hinder a Christian's prayers.
 - 1. Unforgiven sin (Isa. 59:1-2; 55:6-7; 58:6-9)
 - 2. Impure heart (Psalm 66:18; Prov. 28:9)
 - 3. Self-righteousness (Luke 18:9-14)
 - 4. Unforgiving attitude (Matt. 6:15)
 - 5. Lack of faith (James 1:5-8)
 - 6. Selfishness (James 4:3)
 - 7. Trouble in the home (1 Peter 3:7)
 - C. We should seek the remedy for things that hinder our prayers.
- II. PRAYER IS PREDICATED ON FAITH
 - A. James declared that a Christian's prayers must be offered with faith (1:6; 5:15-16).
 - B. There are many valid reasons that one may have faith in God.
 - 1. The Creation Shows Evidence of God
 - a. The universe declares God (Psa. 19:1-3; Rom. 1:18-23).
 - b. God created the world (Gen. 1:1; Exo. 20:11; Ac. 17:24).
 - c. This is far different from the beliefs and theories of men.
 - 2. History Shows Evidence of God
 - a. The descendants of Abraham (Gen. 12:1-3; 15:5, 13-14)
 - b. Jacob Moses (Gen. 49:8-10; Exo. 19:1-6; 24:1-8)
 - c. Captivity and Return
 - d. The fullness of the times (Gal. 4:4; Eph. 1:10)
 - 3. Prophecy Shows Evidence of God
 - a. Isaiah 41
 - b. Vs. 1-7 *God's court case against the idols*
 - i. God prophesied of Cyrus over 100 years before his birth!
 - ii. 44:28; 45:1
 - iii. The idols and idolaters could do nothing of such power.
 - c. Vs. 8-20 God is living and active on behalf of His people
 - d. Vs. 21-29 *God challenges the idols to prove their power*
 - i. God asks them to present their case, to predict the future, or to do anything to demonstrate that they are real and living.
 - ii. But they were nothing and vanity; and those who chose them were an abomination.
 - C. God alone hears and answers prayer!
