BLESSED IS THE MAN WHO HUNGERS FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS

Text: Matthew 5:6

Introduction:

- 1. The biblically blessed are those who depend upon God.
- 2. They inherit the promise made to Abraham by submission to God.
- 3. Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount by describing foundational attitudes that are necessary to follow Him.
- 4. The first "beatitude" is to be poor in spirit.
- 5. The second "beatitude is to mourn.
- 6. The third "beatitude" is meekness.
- 7. The fourth "beatitude" is hunger for righteousness...
- I. The Context
 - A. The Sermon on the Mount
 - B. The Beatitudes build upon one another.
 - 1. One who is poor in spirit will acknowledge that he is a sinner.
 - 2. He will also realize that he cannot save himself.
 - 3. Thus, he will also become one who mourns over his sin.
 - 4. This, in turn, will cause him to give control of his life to God.
 - 5. Upon making this commitment, he will then hunger for righteousness.
- II. The Characteristic
 - A. "Righteousness"
 - 1. Literally, "the state of him who is as he ought to be; the condition acceptable to God; integrity, rightness, correctness of thinking, feeling and acting."
 - 2. Righteousness is justification...
 - a. Romans 4
 - b. Philippians 3:9
 - c. Hebrews 11:7
 - 3. Righteousness is found in the Gospel...
 - a. Romans 1:16-17; 3:21-26
 - b. Acts 24:25
 - c. 2 Timothy 3:16-17
 - 4. Righteousness is obtained by obedience...
 - a. 1 John 3:7-12
 - b. Matthew 5:20; Acts 10:35
 - c. Romans 6:12-19
 - B. "Hunger and Thirst"
 - 1. Man feels and understands physical hunger and thirst.
 - a. Consider Esau (Genesis 25:29-34).

- b. Consider the Israelites (Exodus 16:3).
- c. Consider the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:17).
- 2. Yet, spiritual hunger and thirst are often felt but misunderstood.
 - a. Many try to fill this hunger with worldly pleasures...
 - b. Instead of going to the bread of life (John 6:35).
- 3. We must hunger and thirst for righteousness!
 - a. Psalm 42:1-2; 63:1-2
 - b. Amos 8:11-13
 - c. John 6:27
 - d. Matthew 6:33
- III. The Christian
 - A. The person who mourns over sin will become a Christian.
 - B. He will understand his guilt and need for redemption.
 - C. He will mourn over his sins and repent of them.
 - D. Then, he will submit to the control of God to learn what to do to be saved.
 - E. Upon learning this information, he will possess the strength of his convictions.
 - F. Then, he will have an insatiable desire for the righteousness of God revealed in the Gospel of Christ.
 - G. Thus, he will be filled.
 - 1. For he will seek and study the Word of God.
 - 2. He will continue to desire the sincere milk of the word (1 Pet. 2:2).
 - 3. He will live his life by doing that which God desires.
