BLESSED IS THE MAN WHO IS PURE IN HEART

Text: Matthew 5:8

Introduction:

- 1. The biblically blessed are those who depend upon God.
- 2. They inherit the promise made to Abraham by submission to God.
- 3. Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount by describing foundational attitudes that are necessary to follow Him.
- 4. The first "beatitude" is to be poor in spirit.
- 5. The second "beatitude is to mourn.
- 6. The third "beatitude" is meekness.
- 7. The fourth "beatitude" is hunger for righteousness.
- 8. The fifth "beatitude" is to be merciful.
- 9. The sixth "beatitude" is to be pure in heart...

I. The Context

- A. The Sermon on the Mount
- B. The Beatitudes build upon one another.
 - 1. One who is poor in spirit will acknowledge that he is a sinner.
 - 2. He will also realize that he cannot save himself.
 - 3. Thus, he will also become one who mourns over his sin.
 - 4. This, in turn, will cause him to give control of his life to God.
 - 5. Upon making this commitment, he will then hunger for righteousness.
 - 6. Salvation from sins will motivate one to be merciful toward others.
 - 7. Reflecting on the mercy of God motivates the Christian to remain pure in heart.

II. The Characteristic

A. "Heart"

- 1. Literally, "that organ in the animal body which is the center of the circulation of the blood, and hence was regarded as the seat of physical life; denotes the center of all physical and spiritual life."
- 2. The heart is the seat of the intellect...
 - a. We reason with the heart (Mark 2:8).
 - b. We think with the heart (Hebrews 4:12).
 - c. We understand with the heart (Matthew 13:15).
 - d. We believe with the heart (Romans 10:10).
- 3. The heart is the seat of our emotions...
 - a. The heart desires (Romans 10:1-3).
 - b. The heart sorrows (John 14:1; Nehemiah 2:2).
 - c. The heart loves (Matthew 23:27).
- 4. The heart is the seat of the will...
 - a. The heart holds our intentions (Hebrews 4:12).

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- b. The heart holds our purposes (2 Corinthians 9:7).
- c. The heart holds our determination (Luke 21:14).
- B. "Pure"
 - 1. Literally, "clean, clear; purified by fire; sincere, genuine; free from every mixture of what is false."
 - 2. To be free from disease (Matthew 8:1-3).
 - 3. Symbolically used of Heaven (Revelation 21:18, 21; 22:1).
- C. "Pure in heart"
 - 1. An Undefiled Heart...
 - a. Free from sin (2 Corinthians 7:1; Hebrews 9:14).
 - b. Free from hypocrisy (Matthew 23:25-28).
 - c. Free from guilt (Acts 18:6; 20:26; 1 Timothy 1:5; 3:9).
 - d. Free from defilement (Titus 1:15).
 - 2. An Undivided Heart...
 - a. Sincere (Psalm 15:2).
 - b. Honest (Psalm 24:3-5).
 - c. Impartial (James 3:17).
 - d. Single (James 4:8).
- D. Purifying the heart...
 - 1. Look to God (Psalm 51:6, 10)
 - 2. Word of God (John 15:3)
 - 3. Faith (Acts 15:9)
 - 4. Cleansing (James 4:8)
 - 5. Obeying the Truth (1 Peter 1:22)
 - 6. Blood of Christ (Hebrews 9:14)
 - 7. Baptism (Hebrews 10:22)
 - 8. Practice pure religion (James 1:27)

III. The Christian

- A. The Christian strives to be and remain pure in heart.
- B. For, only the pure in heart will see God (Hebrews 12:14).
 - a. We see God in fellowship (1 John 1:3; 3:6; John 1:14; 14:9).
 - b. We see God in faith (Hebrews 11:27).
 - c. We will see God in the future (Job 19:26-27; 1 John 3:2-3).
- C. The cleansing blood of Christ keeps our hearts clean and pure.
