Is the Church of Christ a Denomination?

Text: Matthew 16:13-19

Introduction:

- 1. Today, denominationalism is all that many people know.
- 2. If transported back to the first century, most would be shocked to find that there was only one church.
- 3. Religious division was well known to the Jews in the sects of the Pharisees (Act 15:5) and Sadducees (Acts 5:17).
- 4. Some even accused the Lord's church of being another Jewish sect (Acts 24:5; 28:22; cf. Acts 24:14-15).
- 5. Is the church of Christ a denomination?

I. **DEFINITIONS**

- A. What is the church?
 - 1. The Greek word translated as "church" is *ekklesia* and it means, "called out."
 - 2. It refers to those who are called by the Gospel out of the world (2 Thessalonians 2:14).
 - 3. Coming out of the world, one is added to the church or kingdom of Jesus (Acts 2:39, 47; Colossians 1:13).
 - 4. Note that the word "church" does not refer to a building.
- B. What is the church of Christ?
 - 1. It is the worldwide collective of all those who have obeyed the Gospel and have been saved from sin (Ephesians 1:22-23; 3:10, 21).
 - 2. It is the local assembly of disciples in a specific location (1 Corinthians 1:2; 4:17; 7:17; cf. Romans 16:16).
- C. What is a denomination?
 - 1. In the Bible, the word "sect" refers to "a body of men separating themselves from others and following their own tenets" (Thayer).
 - 2. A denomination is "a religious organization uniting in a single legal and administrative body a number of local congregations" (Webster).
 - 3. Denominationalism is defined as "devotion to denominational principles or interests" (Webster).
- D. There is no denomination approved by Scripture.
 - 1. A denomination is larger than the local church.
 - 2. A denomination is smaller than the worldwide church.
 - 3. It has no authority to exist.

II. **DECLARATIONS**

- A. The church is God's eternal purpose (Ephesians 3:10-11).
- B. The church was divinely planned:
 - 1. Beginning in Jerusalem (Isaiah 2:1-4)
 - 2. In the last days (Joel 2:28ff; Acts 2:16-21)
 - 3. In the days of the Roman Empire (Daniel 2:44)
 - 4. Built by Jesus (2 Samuel 7:12-17; Matthew 16:18)
- C. The denominations do not fit this plan:
 - 1. The Catholic Church was founded in Rome in AD 606.
 - 2. The Lutheran Church started in Germany in 1517.
 - 3. The Presbyterian Church began in Switzerland in AD 1560.
 - 4. The Baptist Church started in Holland in AD 1608.
 - 5. The Methodist Church began in England in 1740.
 - 6. The Jehovah's Witnesses were founded in America in 1872.
 - 7. The Christian Church started in 1906, and the Disciples of Christ split from them in 1959.
- D. The church of Christ is not a denomination.
- III. **DISTINCTIONS**
 - A. Jesus is the only Head (Ephesians 1:22-23).
 - B. The New Testament is the only doctrine (Acts 2:42).
 - C. Names are authorized and possessive (Romans 16:16).
 - D. Worship is in spirit and in truth (John 4:24).
 - E. The Gospel is the only message (1 Corinthians 15:1-4).
 - F. Organization is only congregational (1 Timothy 3)
 - G. Unity is undenominational (John 17).

Conclusion: *The church of Christ is not a denomination!*
